

## PLASTIC BOTTLES, TUBS AND LIDS

All plastic bottles which have the symbols:



(numbers 1 through 7)

on the bottom. These include bottles for beverages, cleaners and automotive products. All plastic tubs and lids should be clean, please remove lids and place both loose inside the blue box. **DO NOT** include motor oil containers. Also included in this section are polystyrene products (styrofoam packaging from electronic equipment, cups, plastic utensils, meat trays, bakery trays and covers, flower pots and bubble wrap).



### PLASTIC FILM

Plastic film includes grocery bags, (no milk or bread bags as they use a metal to preserve the bread)

### STYROFOAM



(ALL TYPES) Clean food and beverage. Other pieces 10" only.

## CORRUGATED CARDBOARD and BROWN PAPER BAGS

Corrugated cardboard is the strong sandwich like material with the waffle in the middle. It is usually used for shipping material. Flatten and empty the cardboard boxes and brown paper bags. Tie in bundles 65cm x 65cm x 20cm (24"x 24" x 8") or smaller. Dog and cat kraft food bags may be recycled.

## NEWSPAPERS and MAGAZINES

Place clean newspapers, flyers, magazines, and catalogues in a bag or tie with string. Includes all used writing, typing and computer paper, envelopes, junk mail, telephone directories, and paper cups and plates.



*New to our recycling program*, are plain wrapping and tissue paper (not foil paper) and greeting cards.



### CARTONS

Also, now accepted are milk and juice cartons and tetra packs (including drinking boxes). Also Freezer Boxes. **"Must be rinsed"**

## BOX BOARD

Box board such as cereal, cookie, cracker, tissue, detergent and shoe boxes should be flattened and bundled. Bundles should measure no larger than 65cm x 65cm x 20cm (24" x 24" x 8"). Includes paper egg cartons and rolls from paper towels and toilet paper.

## ALUMINUM FOIL and FOIL CONTAINERS

Include all rigid foil containers, fast food trays and aluminum foil wrap. Make sure all materials are clean. **DO NOT** include items with food scraps or grease. No foil with paper or plastic lamination, no cardboard lids, no butter/candy/cigarette wrap, no peel-off lids, no metalized chip bags.



## GLASS BOTTLES and JARS

(Food and Beverage ONLY) Rinse the containers and remove caps and lids. You don't have to remove the labels. **DO NOT** include any other type of glass such as ceramics, mirrors, window glass, drinking glasses, Pyrex, light bulbs or dishes.



### METAL FOOD AND BEVERAGE CANS

Rinse the cans. You don't have to remove labels or flatten the cans. Place metal lids from cans and jars in the bottom of a can and pinch the top of the can to trap the lid inside.

## Empty PAINT CANS

**Step 1.** Make sure your paint can (up to 4 litre or 1 gallon size) is empty. It should have no liquid paint and no more than one-half centimeter (1/4 inch) of dried paint on the bottom. (no plastic paint cans)

**Step 2.** Place the empty can and lid loose in the blue box together with other containers. Leave the lid off so the truck driver can see that the can is empty. Leave the label on the can.

## AEROSOL CANS

**Step 1.** Make sure you have used up the entire product and the aerosol can is empty. You can tell if it is empty by shaking it.

**Step 2.** Place the empty can loose in the blue box together with other containers. You can leave spray nozzles and paper labels on them. Include Pesticide and Herbicide containers if they are empty.

**"Please do not put recyclables in garbage containers/bins or plastic recycle bags"**

**Place all film plastic inside one grocery bag and tie closed. Also, please keep all fiber (paper, boxboard & cardboard) separate from your tin, plastic & glass.**
