BEACHBURG MEDICAL CENTRE We received a lump sum payment of \$10,000 towards the outstanding amount
for the open loan payment from the Beachburg Medical Centre renovations.
BOAT LAUNCH REVENUEWe received a donation for boat launch fees for a recent bass tournament held in
Lapasse on June 28th, 2014. The donation was \$5/per boat for 30 boat entries on that day. The total revenue was \$150
which has been deposited to the GL for boat launch contributions.

The sign reflectivity testing has been completed, Whitewater had 867 signs tested, as well as 694 posts/supports checked.

At this time it was brought to our attention that the "Engineer Grade" material used for certain signs is not meeting the high intensity standards therefore all signs will have to be ordered with the "High Intensity Grade" material that we order for required regulatory signs like stop signs, major curve signs etc.

MONTHLY ACTIVITY: July, 2014

DEPARTMENT:

The stockpile of 163 refrigerated appliances at the Ross Waste Site were pumped, tagged and recycled during the month of July. Evan Hutley from Huntsville was the technician.

John Deere Crawler Loader for the Ross Landfill should arrive early - mid August, 2014.

Cobden CAZ moving to a close. The Department anticipates August will complete the transfer of easements and remaining legal particulars.

One of the large electric blower motors has failed in the Cobden WWTP. OCWA will be looking into a rebuild or replacement. The blower motors (there are 4) pump air into the aeration tanks for extended aeration as well as the aerated sludge tank. OCWA will initiate camera work of upwards of 10% of the Cobden WWTP collection system. This was a forecasted capital

undertaking to get the sewer maintenance program underway. This camera work will offer terrific insight into the state of our underground infrastructure and should be viewed as somewhat of a supportive element to the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment. The Department anticipates the project to begin in August, 2014.

Flushing of the Hydrant system has been carried out by OCWA in the Village of Cobden. The Village of Beachburg is scheduled for hydrant flushing in early September, 2014.

A Non-Agricultural Source Materials Management Plan (NASM) application has been submitted to OMAFRA's Environmental Management Branch for the spreading of biosolids in a local field. Patrick Judge with Jp2g Consultants (Ottawa) has prepared the application and Management Plan on behalf of the Municipality.
