#### DEPARTMENT: **Environmental Services Department MONTHLY ACTIVITY: September, 2014**

The New John Deere 655K Crawler Loader arrived early in the month. The machine is proving to be exceptional at clearing of the tipping area, spreading waste, packing, back-blading, etc.. It carries out several daily functions more efficiently and effectively than an excavator. That said, the excavator does some daily functions more effectively and will continue to be utilized as the two pieces of equipment complement each other very well. Having a back-up machine for maintenance and down-time is encouraging

Attended the Ontario East Municipal Conference in Kingston this month. Very beneficial Conference for the Department to attend.

Changes in the Monitoring Program of the Westmeath Landfill have finally been approved following roughly five (5) years of correspondence, hydrogeological reporting, consultation, monitoring, etc... Patrick Judge with Jp2g Consultants Inc. (Ottawa office) has prepared and submitted an application to spread non-agricultural

source material (NASM) on a resident agricultural field. The application to seasonally spread biosolids form the Cobden Wastewater Plant was submitted to OMAFRA. Upon submission of a Work Permit Application with the Provincial Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry, the Department was instructed to consult with the Federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans reference to the Westmeath Dredging Project. A Request for Review Application for DFO has been completed and submitted for the project.

The brush pile and wood-waste stockpile grinding operations should commence in the nest week or two. Killaloe Wood Products have been tasked with the job after submitting their price.

The Fall Hazardous Waste Event for residents was again well attended with a chemical disposal cost in the range of \$10,000. Steven Hodson, Environmental Services Manager

# Reeves Renfrew County Report For the Month of September

Reeves Renfrew County Report For the Month of September During the month of September, I attended one full day meeting and three half day meetings. The Ontario Renovates Program provides assistance to home owners by way of a forgivable loan to repair their homes for energy efficiency or increasing accessibility. Target groups for this program include low income seniors and persons with disabilities. The last funding from Province was for \$181,404. Six residents' homes over the past three years received help in Whitewater Region. On February 27, 2014, the County of Renfrew along with the District Health Unit made an application for Healthy Kids Community Challenge Grant. On September 11, 2014, we were advised that County of Renfrew was successful and selected to participate in this initiative. The funding received is in the amount of 1.1 million dollars divided over 4 years. In a news release dated September 24, 2014, Reeve Donald Rathwell, had this to say: *"This funding will make a direct and long lasting impact on the health and wellbeing of children and youth in our communities. I look forward to working with all our partners to make positive change happen."*

I have asked the Warden and County Davidor Development Officer to attend the Whitewater Region Council Meeting on October 1, 2014 for an update on the AECL Restructuring.
