RE: Flood Monitoring and Mitigation Measures

Whitewater Region, Ontario - April 15, 2024

The Whitewater Region Municipal Emergency Control Group (MECG) met this morning to review localized conditions and implementation per the Township Flood Readiness Plan.

This meeting follows the Ottawa River Regulation Planning Board (ORRPB) Press Release of April 14, 2024, advising watershed residents of the rising levels along the main stem of the Ottawa River which could create possible flooding in low-lying areas over the coming weeks (low-lying areas are those that are regularly flooded during the spring freshet period) - See Latest News at <https://ottawariver.ca/>.

The situation is being monitored by the Township, and the ORRPB are forecasting the levels to stabilize and lower in the coming days. The Township remains in continued communications with the Renfrew County Emergency Management Community of Practice Spring Freshet 2024 - including the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNR), Ontario Power Generation (OPG), the Ontario River Regulation Planning Board (ORRPB), Renfrew County and neighboring municipalities.

Roads

The Township's Public Works Department is monitoring roads for flooding and potential closures. Visual observations were conducted by Township staff which have observed some low-lying areas and roads in the Township experiencing minor flooding.

Municipal511.ca is being updated to report flooded roads as they become known. The Township advises residents in low-lying areas affected by flooding that access may be restricted by emergency services.

Mitigation Measures

Residents who have been affected by high water and flow conditions in the past should take necessary action to protect/secure any vulnerable property in proximity to rivers and lakes and closely monitor developing conditions and regularly check for updated messages.

The Township is prepared to implement the necessary mitigation measures (i.e., sand and sandbags, site command, etc.) and are awaiting updated water level forecasts (precipitation, wind speed and direction) to ensure an informed decision from the MECG.

Information Gathering

For safety, all residents should monitor weather conditions, check for updated messaging, and exercise caution near fast-moving water.
