

BURN PERMITS

RECREATIONAL BURNS

Recreational burns (campfires) are to be contained in a fire-resistant enclosure of metal or stone. These types of fires can be no larger than 2' by 2' by 2' or 60cm by 60cm by 60cm. Fuel must only consist of dry untreated wood, no pressure treated lumber or plywood, no grass clippings and never any garbage.

OPEN AIR BURNS

Open air burns are for the disposal of small amounts of dry brush. Open air burning must take place from sunset to sunrise unless an exemption has been granted by the fire chief or designate. This is due to the typical decrease in temperature, increased humidity, and a drop in wind speed overnight. Open air burns must be no larger than 6' by 6' by 6' or 2m by 2m by 2m.

Fuel must consist of dry brush or untreated lumber only. Garbage and the burning of hay is not permitted due to the environmental impact and the smoke disrupting neighboring properties.

AGRICULTURAL BURNS

Agricultural burns are for large scale fencerow clearing or other similar situations. These permits require a site visit to ensure safety and by-law compliance.

SAFETY TIPS

Always have a means to extinguish your fire present. This could be a garden hose, fire extinguisher or shovel and dirt. Never leave burns unattended, even for short periods of time. Garbage is never permitted to be burnt. Please take all garbage to the landfill located at 990 Kohlsmith Road (Wednesday & Saturdays 8am-2pm)

Before every burn call 1-855-922-2652 to register your burn and to confirm there is no restrictions in place.

Registration is available through the City of Pembroke. Registration information and class times are available on their website.

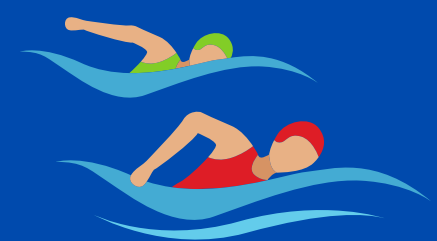

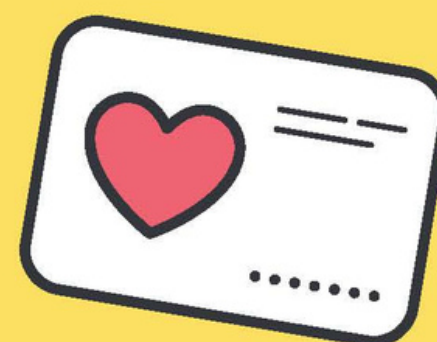
Lessons start on the Monday following each registration session. Lessons runs for 8 days excluding weekends and holidays.

2022 ELECTION

The Township of Whitewater Region's municipal election will take place on
Monday, October 24, 2022.

Eligible individuals may consider running for one of the following offices:

Mayor - one elected at large

Deputy Mayor - one elected at large

Councillor - five elected at large

School Board Trustee

Monday, May 2, 2022 is the first day eligible individuals may file nomination forms for the offices of Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Councillors and School Board Trustee for the 2022 municipal elections. In addition, it is the first day to file a notice of registration as a third party advertiser. This must be done at the office of the Township of Whitewater Region (44 Main Street, Cobden) by appointment only. The deadline for candidates to submit nomination forms is Friday, August 19, 2022 at 2 pm.

INFORMATION FOR VOTERS

You need to be on the voter's list in order to vote in a municipal council or school board election. To find out if you are on the list to vote please visit
www.voterlookup.ca.

You can add yourself, confirm or update your personal information, change your school support for the purpose of elections and add other electors under your address. You are required to show identification to vote. Identification must include name and address. Photo or signature is not required.

LANDFILL



The Ross Landfill Site is located at 990 Kohlsmith Road and is open Wednesday and Saturday 8am - 2pm. The landfill accepts solid, non-hazardous waste and serves as the Township's long-term centralized waste disposal facility.

Item specific recycling for scrap metal, electronics and scrap tires occurs at the landfill. Stockpiling of clean leaf, yard and brush as well as separated clean lumber is carried out for grinding purposes as well. Refrigerated appliances are accepted at the landfill.

Proof of residency is required upon entering the Landfill.
