

By-Law No. 17. 1864

A. By-Law to authorize the payment of certain sums of money therein mentioned

Whereas it is necessary to pay the several sums of money herein mentioned.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of Westmeath, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Canada, entitled, "An Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada"; and it is hereby enacted by virtue of and under the authority of the same, that Newton Eggleston be paid the sum of eleven dollars and seventy-five cents, being his costs in prosecuting Hiram Thrasher and Brown for selling liquors in the Township of Westmeath without License, that John Porteous be paid the sum of one hundred five and one half dollars (\$105.50) for a Bridge on the Government road between Mr Crackin's and Sullivan's, and that ^{Robert} Richard Graham be paid the sum of twenty dollars be paid for attending a Bridge on the Muskeg Flat Lake for the present year.
