PEMBROKE, Jan. 12th, 1864.

To the Reeve and Council of the Township of *Westmeath*

Gentlemen,

At the suggestion of several Reeves, I herewith transmit to you an offer to do the Township Advertising.

I propose to insert in *Pembroke Observer* the Auditor's Report, Notices of Court of Revision, Opening up Roads, Meetings of Council, and any other notices found necessary by your body; and also to insert the Minutes of all your Meetings, if furnished by the Clerk—for which I would charge only \$25 per annum. And in order that each Councillor may have the newspapers containing the Advertisements and Minutes for reference, or for the information of any ratepayer, I will, if my offer is accepted, furnish the paper to each Councillor and to the Clerk without charge.

Of course you will be aware that the Township Accounts, and other advertisements, are required by law to be published in a County paper, it will therefore be nothing more than reasonable for me to expect such advertisements, whether you accept the above offer or not.

If you accept my offer, the Clerk will please inform me of the Names and Post Office address of himself and Councillors, that I may forward the *Observer* immediately.

I may also mention that I have reduced the subscription price of the *Observer* to One Dollar per annum, and shall have an agent travelling the County for subscribers during the winter, so that it is expected a larger circulation will shortly be obtained in your Township.

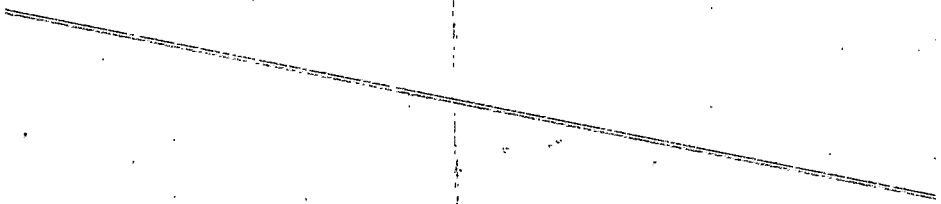

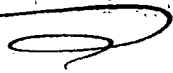
