

By-Law No. 4- 1865.

A By-Law to authorize the payment of certain sums of money therein mentioned.

Whereas it is necessary to pay the several sums of money herein after mentioned,

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of Westmeath, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Canada, entitled, "An Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada", and it is hereby enacted by virtue of and under the ~~same~~ that authority of the same, that, the Clerk be paid the sum of two  $\frac{67}{100}$  dollars for Postages to 15<sup>th</sup> April '65 - that William Russell be paid the sum of fifty Cents for cutting Stone wood, - that Joseph Keyes be paid the sum of forty-eight dollars as Collector <sup>'64</sup>, the sum of forty dollars as assessor for '65 the sum of forty-three  $\frac{70}{100}$  dollars for Collecting School rates for 1864, the sum of one dollar for a Lin Case for Poll, and the sum of two dollars for Postage and Stationery, amounting in all for Joseph Keyes to the sum of one hundred and thirty-four dollars and seventy Cents - that Mrs. Elizabeth Carmichael be paid the sum of eight  $\frac{74}{100}$  dollars being arrears of Taxes on Lot No. 11 in the 9<sup>th</sup> Concession for the year 1853 charged in mistake against said Lot, that the Reeve ~~be~~ be paid the sum of fifteen dollars for extra expenses in travelling on Municipal matters, and the sum of seven dollars for his expenses in making necessary inquiries for the Council, at Pembroke - the sum to be paid to the Reeve - amounting in all to the sum of twenty-~~seven~~ <sup>two</sup> dollars that John E. Collins be paid the sum of four  $\frac{25}{100}$  dollars, being amount of his Taxes for 1864 which have been cancelled by the Council, that Prittie Lewis be paid the sum of three  $\frac{40}{100}$  dollars being the amount of her Taxes for 1864 cancelled by the Council, and that -

Widow Fraser be paid the sum of two dollars, being her Taxes for 1864 cancelled by the Council, and that the sum of eight dollars be paid to Widow Stubbs, being the amount granted to her as an indigent person.
