

To the Municipal Council of the Township
of Westmeath

GENTLEMEN,—

Knowing that the law requires each Municipality to publish certain things, such as the opening and closing of roads, sittings of courts of revision, auditors' reports, &c., in a newspaper printed within the County, where such exists, and thinking you wish to comply with the law in this respect, I take the liberty of making you the following proposal:

To do all the advertising required and to publish a condensed report of the minutes of meetings, during 1865, through the columns of my paper, for the sum of \$20 payable at the end of the year, or for the sum of \$16 if paid in advance.

It will be necessary, in order to receive the benefit of the above offer, that your Clerk inform me prior to the 1st of March of your acceptance of it, as otherwise regular rates will be charged on any advertising sent during the year.

Where my offer is accepted the Township Clerk will be furnished with the paper free of charge, that he may see that the work is properly performed.

All Councillors in this County will be furnished with the *Observer* during the year 1865 on payment in advance of 2s 6d each.
