

By-Law No. 4 — 1876.

A By-Law concerning Fermented or Spirituous Liquors and the Sale thereof within the Township of Westmeath in the County of Renfrew.

Whereas it is necessary to pass a By-Law defining the Conditions and Qualifications requisite to obtain a Renewal of Tavern Licenses in the Township of Westmeath from the first day of March next until the first day of May thereafter,

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Township of Westmeath in the County of Renfrew, pursuant to an Act of the Legislature of Ontario passed during its last Session, enacts as follows, viz—

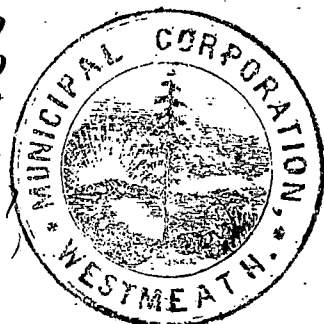
That By-Law Number 3-1875, passed by the Municipal Council of the said Township of Westmeath on the first day of February 1875, shall be the By-Law under the provisions of which, Tavern Licenses may be renewed within the said Township from the first day of March now next ensuing the date of the passing of this By-Law, until the first day of May next thereafter, upon application therefor, and upon payment of the sum of Five dollars and eighty-four cents, viz— two dollars and fifty cents to the Issuer of Licenses for Provincial Duty thereon and three dollars and thirty-four cents to the Treasurer of this Municipality to its use; but that it shall not be necessary for the Inspector of Licenses to re-examine the Houses and premises of the parties so applying for a renewal of License for said term and that such renewals of License shall be granted only to such parties in the said Township as have obtained Licenses for the year ending the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March 1876.

That the duties of the Inspector of Licenses for the said Township shall be those laid down in the above quoted By-Law No. 3-1875, excepting those mentioned and contained in clause 19. of the said By-Law.

That this By-Law shall take effect from and after the passing thereof.
