PENALTIES: Neglect to feed impounded animals, s. 23. Neglect of duty of fence viewers, s. 24. Recovery, s. 25. Application, s. 26. Returns, ss. 27-29.

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario,

enacts as follows :---

1. Until varied or other provisions are made by by -law passed under the authority of section 546 of " The Municipal Act, " this Act shall be in force in every township, city, town. and incorporated village in Ontario. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 1.

2. The owner or occupant of any land shall be responsible for any damage caused by any animal under his charge and keeping, as though such animal were his own property, and the owner of any animal not permitted to run at large by the by-laws of the municipality, shall be liable for any damage done by such animal, although the fence enclosing the premises was not of the hight required by such by laws. R. S. O.

1887, c. 215, s. 2.

3. If not previously replevied, the pound-keeper shall impound any horse, bull, ox, cow, sheep, goat. pig, or other cattle, geese or other poultry, distrained for unlawfully running at large, or for trespassing and doing damage, delivered to him for that purpose by any person resident within his division who has distrained the same; or if the owner of geese or other poultry refuses or neglects to prevent the same from trespassing on his neighbours' premises after a notice in writing has been served upon him of their trespass, then the owner of such poultry may be brought before any Justice of the Peace and fined such sum as the Justice directs. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 3.

4. Where any animal has been impounded the pound-keeper shall within twenty four hours, deliver to the Clerk of the municipality a notice in writing containing a description of the color, age and natural and artificial marks of the ani-

mal as near as may be. 60 V. e. 45, s. 78.

5. When the common pound of the municipality or place wherein a distress has been made is not secure, the poundkeeper may confine the animal in any enclosed place within the limits of the pound-keeper's division within which the distress was made. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 4.

6. The owner of any animal impounded shall at any time be entitled to his animal, on demand made therefor, without payment of any poundage fees, on giving satisfactory security to the pound-keeper for all costs, damages, and poundage fees that may be established against him, but the person distraining and impounding the animal shall, at the time of the impounding, deposit poundage fees, if such are demanded, and within twenty-four hours thereafter deliver to the pound-keeper duplicate statements in writing of his demands against the owner for damages (if any] not exceeding \$20, done by such animal, exclusive of such poundage fees, and shall also give his written agreement (with a surety if required by the pound-keeper) in the form following, or in words to the same effect:

"I (or we as the case may be) do hereby agree that I [or we] will pay to the owner of the (describing the animal) by me (A. B.] this day impounded, all costs to which the said owner may be put in case the distress by me the said A. B. proves to be illegal, or in case the claim for damages now put in by me the said A. B. fails to be established."

R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 5.

7. In case the animal destrained is a horse, bull, ox, cow, sheep, goat, pig or other cattle, and if the same is destrained by a resident of the municipality for straying within his premises, such person, instead of delivering the animal to a pound-keeper, may retain the animal in his own possession, provided he makes no claim for damages done by the animal, and duly gives the notices hereinalter in that case required of him. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 6.

8. If the owner is known to him, he shall forthwith give to the owner notice in writing of having taken up the animal. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 7.

9. If the owner is unknown to the person taking up and retaining possession of the animal, such person shall, within forty-eight hours, deliver to the Clerk of the municipality a notice in writing of having taken up the animal, and containing a description of the color, age and natural and artificial marks of the animal, as near as may be R.S. O. 1887, c. 215 s. 8.

10. The Clerk, on receiving such notice, shall forthwith enter a copy thereof in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall post the notice he receives, or a copy there-

of, in some conspicuous place on or near the door of his office, and continue the same so posted for at least one week, unless the animal is sooner claimed by the owner. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 9.

11. If the animal or any number of animals taken up at the same time is or are of the value of \$10 or more, the distrainor shall cause a copy of the notice to be published in a newspaper in the county, if one is published therein, and if not, then in a newspaper published in an adjoining county, and to be continued therein once a week for three successive weeks. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 10.

12. In case an animal is impounded, notices for the sale thereof shall be given by the pound-keeper or person who impounded the animal within forty-eight hours afterwards, but no pig or poultry shall be sold till after four clear days, nor any horse or other cattle till after eight clear days from the time of impounding the same. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 11.

13. In case the animal is not impounded, but is retained in the possession of the party distraining the same, if the animal is a pig, goat or sheep, the notices for the sale thereof shall not be given for one month, and if the animal is a horse or other cattle, the notices shall not be given for two months after the animal is taken up. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 12.

14. The notices of sale may be written or printed, and shall be affixed and continued for three clear succe-sive days, in three public places in the municipality, and shall specify the time and place at which the animal will be publicly sold, if not sooner replevied or redeemed by the owner or some one on his behalf, paying the penalty imposed by law (if any), the amount of the injury [if any] claimed or decided to have been committed by the animal to the property of the person who distrained it, together with the lawful fees and charges of the pound-keeper, and also the fence-viewers (if any); and the expenses of the animal's keeping. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 13

15. Every pound-keeper, and every person who impounds or confines, or causes to be impounded or confined, any animal in any common pound or in any open or close pound, or in any enclosed place, shall daily furnish the animal with good and sufficient food, water and shelter, during the whole time that such animal continues impounded or confined. R.

S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 14.

16. Every such person who furnishes the animal with food, water and shelter, may recover the value thereof from the owner of the animal, and also a reasonable allowance for his time, trouble and attendance in the premises. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 15.

17. The value or allowance as aforesaid may be recovered with costs, by summary proceeding before any Justice of the Peace within whose jurisdiction the animal was impounded, in like manner as fines, penalties or forfeitures for the breach of any by-law of the municipality may by law be recovered and enforced by a single Justice of the Peace; and the Justice shall ascertain and determine the amount of such value and allowance when not otherwise fixed by law, adhering, so far as applicable, to the tariff of poundkeepers' fees and charges established by the by-laws of the municipality. R.S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 16.

18. The pound-keeper, or person so entitled to proceed may instead of such summary proceeding, enforce the remuneration to which he is intitled in manner hereinafter mentioned. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 17.

19. In case it is proved by affidavit before one of the Justices aforesaid, to his satisfaction, that all the proper notices had been duly affixed and published in the manner and for the respective times above prescribed, then if the owner or some one for him does not within the time specified in the notices, or before the sale of the animal, replevy or redeem the same in manner aforesaid, the pound-keeper who impounded the animal, or if the person who took up the animal did not deliver such animal to any pound-keeper, but retained the same in his own possession, then any pound-keeper of the municipality may publicly sell the animal to the highest bidder, at the time and place mentioned in the aforesaid notices, and after deducting the penalty and the damages (if any) and fees and charges, shall apply the product in discharge of the value of the food and nourishment, loss of time, trouble and attendance so supplied as aforesaid, and of the expenses of driving or conveying and impounding or confining the animal, and of the sale and attending the same, or incidental thereto, and of the damage when legally claimable (not exceeding \$20.) to be ascertained as aforesaid, done by the animal to the property of the person at whose suit the same was distrained, and shall return the surplus [if any] to the original owner of the animal, or if not claimed by him within three months after the sale, the pound-keeper shall pay such surplus to the treasurer of and for the use of the municipality. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 18.

20. If the owner, within forty-eight hours after the delivery of such statements, as povided in section 6. disputes the amount of the damages so claimed, the amount shall be decided by the majority of three fence-viewers of the municipality one to be named by the owner of the animal, one by the person distraining or claiming damages, and the third by the

pound-keeper. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 19.

21. Such fence-viewers or any two of them shall, within twenty-four hours after notice of their appointment as aforesaid, view the fence and the ground upon which the animal was found doing damage, and determine whether or not the fence was a lawful one according to the statutes or by-laws in that behalf at the time of the trespass: and if it was a lawful fence then they shall appraise the damages committed, and, within twenty-four hours after having made the view, shall deliver to the pound-keeper a written statement signed by at least two of them of their appraisment and of their lawful fees and charges. R. S. O. 1887. c. 215, s. 20.

22. If the fence-viewers decide that the fence was not a lawful one, they shall certify the same in writing under their hands, together with a statement of their lawful fees to the pound keeper, who shall, upon payment of all lawful fees and charges, deliver such animal to the owner if claimed before the sale thereof, but if not claimed, or if such fees and charges are not paid, the pound-keeper, after due notice, as required by this Act, shall sell the animal in the manner before mentioned at the time and place appointed in the notices. R.

S. O.1887, c. 215, s. 21,

23. In case a pound-keeper or person who impounds or confines, or causes to be impounded or confined, any animal as aforesaid, refuses or neglects to find, provide and supply the animal with good and sufficient food, water and shelter as aforesaid, he shall, for every day during which he so refuses

or neglects, forfeit a sum not less than \$1, nor more than \$4. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 22.

24. Any fence-viewer neglecting his duty as arbitrator as aforesaid, shall incure a penalty of \$2, to be recovered for the use of the municipality, by summary proceedings before a Justice of the Peace upon the complaint of the party aggrived or the treasurer of the municipality. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s.

25. Every fine and penalty imposed by this Act may be recovered and enforced, with costs, by summary conviction, before any Justice of the Peace for the county or of the municipality in which the offence was committed; and indefault of payment the offender may be committed to the common gaol, house of correction, or lock-up house of the county or municipality, there to be imprisoned for any time in the discretion of the convicting and committing Justice, not exceeding fourteen days, unless the fine and penalty, and costs, including the costs of the committal, are sooner paid. R. S. O. 1887, c. 215, s. 24.

26. When not otherwise provided, every pecuniary penalty recovered beforeany Justice of the Peaceunder this Actshall be paid and dis ributed in the following manner: one moiety to the city, town, village or township in which the offence was committed, and the other moiety thereof, with full costs, to the person who informed and prosecuted for the same, or to such other person as to the Justice seems proper. R. S. O. 1887, c.

215, s. 25.
27. Every pound-keeper and every other person who under the provisions of section 13 of this Act, distrains any animal shall, on or before the 15th day of January in every year, file with the clerk of the municipality a statement for the year ending on the 31st day of December prior to that in which the statement is filed showing:

- 1. The number of animals impounded or distrained, as the case may be;
  - 2. The number of animals sold and the amounts received;
  - 3. The sum received as poundage fees and cost of keep by

the pound-keeper or party distraining;

- 4. The amount of damage paid by any party;
- 5. All disbursements and to whom paid;
- 7. Any other receipts and expenditures in connection therewith. 56 V. c. 47, s. 1 (26).

28. The said statement shall be certified to by the pound-keeper or the person distraining as a true and accurate statement for the year ending on the 31st day of December prior to that in which the statement is filed. 56 V. c. 47, s. 1 [27).

29. Any pound-keeper or other person required to file such return, neglecting or refusing to file the same on or before the 15th day of January in any year, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding \$10, to be recovered as are other penalties under this Act. 56 V. c. 47, s. 1 [28).

#### BY-LAW No. 484.

To amend and consolidate the by-laws and regulations of this municipality affecting statute labor.

The municipal council of the corporation of the Town-

ship of Ancaster enacts as follows,

1st. That by-law No. 433 passed on April 5th 1898 commuting statute labor at the fixed rate of fifty cents (50c) for each days labor, and directing that the amount of each persons commutation tax to be added in a separate column opposite each persons name in the collectors roll, and to be collected and accounted for like other taxes, is hereby confirmed and that the commutation tax shall be kept by the treasurer in a separate account to be known as "The Commuted Statute Labor Account."

Supervision of Road Divisions.

2nd. One Councillor each to have the supervision of the several road divisions allotted to him from time to time as per list prepared by the Council in each year.

#### Twenty three Road Divisions.

3rd. The public highways of the township shall be divided into twenty three labor districts or road divisions (particularly defined in road books supplied to overseers) and over each of these twenty three road divisions, there shall be appointed a single overseer annually to hold office during the pleasure of the Council or until his successor is appointed.

#### General Duties of Road Overseers.

4th. It shall be the duty of each of the twenty three road overseers who may be appointed to carry out the provisions of this by-law,

1. To make and subscribe before the Clerk or any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction within the munipality his declaration of office in manner prescribed by law;

2. To aquaint himself with the best and most modern

methods of constructing and maintaining good roads;

3. To employ, and direct and discharge all men and

teams he may require to carry on his work;

4. To begin the annual labor as early in the spring of each year as the condition of the roads will permit and work continuously till the apportionment to his division for the year is exhausted;

5. To plane or scrape any of the roads in his division

when ever in his judgment they may require it;

6. To keep the bridges slucies and ditches in his jurisdiction open and in repair and the highways free from obstruction at all times;

7. To properly protect by railing or otherwise all pits, precipices, deep waters, and other places dangerous to travel;

8. To see that the provisions of the Act to prevent the spreading of thistles and noxious weeds upon highways and road allowances are carried out;

9. To cause the roads in his division that are required by the public in winter, to be made and kept open during the

season of sleighing in each year;

10. To crown or round the roadways in the centre so as to shed the water to the side ditches, the crown on level roads not to exceed one inch of raise in each foot of width from side

to centre, shoulders must not be allowed to form next the roadway;

#### Commuted Labor Expressly for Maintenance and Repairs of Highways.

5th. All expenditure for road materials, tools or machinery, or for jobs or contracts similar to what have hitherto been met out of the general funds of the municipality shall continue to be met from the same source, to be still known as the Road and Bridges Account, leaving the commuted statute labor moneys of each year to be applied in that year exclusively toward the maintenance and repair of the highways of the Township.

#### Paying for work done.

6th. Each overseer shall keep an accurate record (in a book supplied for that purpose) of the men employed and the work done by him under this by-law, and shall furnish to the Council in such written form (as pay sheet furnished) and at such intervals as his instructions may require, properly itemized statements made up from these records, and duly certified by him, accompanied by any vouchers pertaining thereto, the Council being satisfied of the correctness of such statements may order the same to be paid.

#### Roadways-

7th. In order to remedy the inequalites that at present exist throughout the township in the width of those portions of its highways which are intended for the use of vehicles, it is hereby further enacted, that hereafter the Road Overseers in reconstructing or regrading any highways, shall aim at uniform standard width of track or roadway of not less than 16 feet, nor more than 24 feet according to the importance of the road.

#### Remuneration of Overseers and Others

8th. A days work for all persons engaged under this by-law, shall consist of ten hours faithful service exclusive of the time spent going to and coming from work, but payment

in all cases (except upon job or contract work) shall be by the hour as follows viz:

Overseers 15 cents per hour.

Laboring men 12½ "
Man and team 27½ "

By-laws Repealed.

9th. That all by-laws of this municipality inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

That the Reeve and Clerk of the Municipality are hereby authorized to make sale and to dispose of the said lands by Public Auction or otherwise for the best price to be obtained therefor and for the purposes of such sale to execute and affix the Corporate Seal of the Municipality to the necessary Deed of Conveyance or other assurances of said property to the purchaser or purchasers thereof.

Parties are required to take notice that the Act will be strictly enforced.
