BY-LAW NO.

A By-Law To Prohibit The Sale of Spirituous, Fermented, and Other Manufactured Liquors, In The Township of Westmeath, as Provided By "The Liquor License Act."

WHEREAS a petition in writing, signed by at least twenty-five per cent. of the total number of persons appearing by the last revised Voters' List of the Municipality of the Township of Westmeath, to be qualified to vote at Municipal elections, has been presented to the Municipal Council of the said Township, praying for the submission to the electors of the said municipality for their approval, a by-law prohibiting the sale of spirituous, fermented or other manufactured liquors in the Township of Westmeath, and thereupon it is the duty of the said Council to submit such by-law to a vote of the Municipal Electors aforesaid, the Municipal Council of the Township of Westmeath therefore hereby enacts

1. That on and after the 1st day of May, A.D., 1907, (if this by-law has received the approval of the municipal electors of the Township of Westmeath, in accordance with the provisions of Section 24 of Chapter 47 of the Statutes of Ontario 6 Edward VII.), the sale by retail of spirituous, fermented or other manufactured liquors in any tavern, inn or other house of public entertainment in the said Township of Westmeath, also the sale thereof, except by wholesale, in shops and places other than houses of public entertainment in the said Township shall be prohibited.

2. That this by-law shall be submitted to the municipal electors on the first Monday in January, A.D., 1907, during the same hours, at the same places and by the same officers as are employed to conduct and hold the annual election of Reeve and Councillors for the said Township of Westmeath, and the said by-law shall be submitted on said day, although there be no election held for Reeve or Councillors for the said Township; and all necessary steps shall be taken by the Clerk of the said municipality to provide the necessary ballot papers, as provided by Section 340 of "The Consolidated Municipal Act, 1903," and the necessary books, equipment, etc., and generally to do and perform all such acts as are necessary to have this by-law properly and legally submitted to the said electors, for their approval.

3. That the number of votes given for and against this by-law shall be summed up by the Clerk of this municipality at the Town Hall in the village of Beachburg, in the said Township of Westmeath on Tuesday, the 8th day of January, A.D., 1907, at the hour of twelve o'clock, noon; and the Reeve of the said municipality will be at the Town Hall in the said village of Beachburg on Saturday the fifteenth day of December, A.D. 1906, at the hour of one o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of appointing the requisite number of persons to attend each polling place and also to attend at the final summing up of the votes, as is provided by Section 342 of "The Consolidated Municipal Act, 1903."

4. This by-law, if it receives the approval of the required number of electors voting, shall be finally passed within six weeks after the vote thereon.

5. This by-law, when finally passed shall take effect on the first day of May, A.D., 1907.

BY-LAW No.

A By-Law to prohibit the sale of spirituous, fermented ~~and~~ *or* other manufactured liquors, in the Township of Westmeath, as provided by "The Liquor License Act"

W H E R E A S a Petition in writing, signed by at least Twenty-five per cent of the total number of persons appearing by the last revised Voters' list of the Municipality of the Township of Westmeath, to be qualified to vote at Municipal Elections, has been presented to the Municipal Council of the said Township, praying for the submission to the Electors of the said Municipality for their approval, a by-law prohibiting the sale of spirituous, fermented or other manufactured liquors in the Township of Westmeath, and thereupon it is the duty of the said Council to submit such by-law to a vote of the Municipal electors aforesaid.....

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTMEATH, therefore hereby enacts.

1. That on and after the first day of May A.D. 1907 (if this by-law has received the approval of the Municipal Electors of the Township of Westmeath, in accordance with the provisions of Section 24 of Chapter 47 of the Statutes of Ontario 6 Edw'd VII), the sale by retail of spirituous, fermented or other manufactured liquors in any Tavern, Inn or other house of Public entertainment in the said Township of Westmeath, also the sale thereof, except by whole-sale, in Shops and Places other than houses of public entertainment in the said Township shall be prohibited.....

2. THAT this by-law shall be submitted to the Municipal Electors on the first Monday in January A.D. 1907, during the same hours, at the same places and by the same officers as are employed to conduct and hold the annual election of Reeve and Councillors for the said Township of Westmeath, and the said by-law shall be submitted on said day, although there

be no election held for Reeve or Councillors for the said Township; and all necessary steps shall be taken by the Clerk of the said Municipality to provide the necessary ballot papers, as provided by Section 340 of "The Consolidated Municipal Act 1903, and the necessary books, equipment &c, and generally to do and perform all such acts as are necessary to have this by-law properly and legally submitted to the said Electors, for their approval.

3. THAT the number of votes given for and against this by-law shall be summed up by the Clerk of this Municipality at the Town Hall in the Village of Beachburgh in the said Township of Westmeath on *Tuesday* the *Eighth* day of January A.D. 1907 at the hour of *Twelve* o'clock ~~in the~~ noon; AND the Reeve of the said Municipality will be at the Town Hall in the said Village of Beachburgh on *Saturday* the *fifteenth* day of December A.D. 1906 at the hour of *one* o'clock in the *afternoon* for the purpose of appointing the requisite number of persons to attend each polling place and also to attend at the final summing up of the votes, as is provided by Section 342 of "The Consolidated Municipal Act 1903"
