MINUTES OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE COUNTY OF RENFREW

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, COURT HOUSE,

Pembroke, 16th June, 1908.

Owing to the Provincial elections falling on the 8th day of June, the day immediately preceding the day on which the Council at its January Session decided to meet again, the Warden and Clerk, under the authority of Rule 3 of the Rules of Order, postponed the meeting one week and notices of the postponement were duly forwarded to each member of the council accordingly. The Council therefore this day assembled, the Warden occupying the chair and every member present except Messrs. Burton, (Cobden), Cooke, (Ross) and Scollard, (Bagot & Blythefield):

The Clerk informed the council that Mr. W. D. Wilson had filed the Clerk's certificate of his election as Reeve of Bagot & Blythefield and took his seat accordingly.

The Clerk also stated that since the January session Mr. Lacey had resigned his office of Reeve of the Village of Eganville, but at a subsequent election he had been chosen Reeve and having filed the Clerk's certificate of that fact he took his seat again, as a member of this council.

The minutes of the last days proceedings of the January session were accepted as read and confirmed, they having been printed and circulated. On motion of Mr. Wingle, seconded by Mr. Hough.

The following communications, etc. were then introduced by the clerk.

1. County Auditors' report on the Treasurer's accounts for the year ending 31st December, 1907.
2. Board of Education, Renfrew, with statistics and statement of claim for excess maintainance on account of county pupils.
3. R. Geo. Scott, B. A., praying to be relieved of his office of County Inspector of Public Schools on account of increasing years and failing health.
4. Mr. M. D. Graham, Secretary of the Arnprior Board of Education reporting that Mr. Geo. F. Macnab, appointed a High School trustee at the January session, had declined to accept the office.
5. Petition of certain ratepayers of the township of Raglan against by-law No. 63 of that municipality, passed the 14th day of March, 1908, dividing School Section No. 10.
6. Deputy Minister of Education advising that the legislative grants to this county for the rural schools, on account of Equipment and Accommodation, were, for Separate Schools \$132 and for Public Schools \$1860 in all \$1992 and to which the county is to levy an equivalent as the law provides.
7. Deputy Minister of Education advising that the Legislative grants to high schools of this county for the school year ending June, 1907, were as follows, viz.: Arnprior, \$768.89 Pembroke, \$891.82, Renfrew, \$1,142.07.
8. Brantford Memorial Association for promoting the purpose of erecting a monument in that his native city, to Alexander Bell, the inventor of the telephone, asking contributions.
9. Ontario Municipal Association, advising of its annual meeting at Toronto in August next, and soliciting the appointment of delegates thereto.

10. Carswell & Co., Toronto, soliciting order for statutes of 1908.

11. Edwin T. White, B. A., requesting to be considered an applicant for the office of county inspector of public schools in the event of the council accepting the resignation of Mr. Scott.

12. Application for a grant of \$100 to aid the municipality of the township of Sebastopol in repairing a bridge across Hurd's Creek on the Eganville and Foymount road.

13. County treasurer's report.

Notices of the intention of councillors to introduce bylaws were then given as follows :

1. To appoint a High School Trustee for Arnprior in the room and stead of Geo. F. Macnab, resigned, Mr. Lacey.

2. To appoint a County Board of Examiners for teacher's third-class certificates, Mr. Lynch.

3. To provide for the payment of moneys, Mr. Wingle.

4. To levy a rate for county purposes, Mr. Humphries.

5. To equalize the assessment rolls for county purposes, Mr. Delahaye.

Moved by Mr. Thos. Gorman, seconded by Mr. O'Brien, that Messrs. Delahaye, Hough, Lacey, Andrews, Stuart, Humphries and Kitt be a committee to equalize the assessment rolls of the several local municipalities for 1907 for county purposes. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Delehaye, seconded by Mr. Behan, that whereas Mr. John P. Lacey was a member of this council at the January session as the Reeve of Eganville but subsequently resigned his said office of Reeve and was re-elected thereto. It is therefore hereby resolved that Mr. Lacey shall act as a member of the several committees upon which he was appointed at the said January session as though he had held the office continuously. Carried.

On motion of Mr. Wingle, seconded by Mr. Hough, the council then adjourned to meet again at ten o'clock tomorrow forenoon.

Your Educational Committee beg leave to report as follows:

1. That Dr. W. F. McKay be appointed High School Trustee for the Town of Arnprior to fill the unexpired term of George F. Macnab, resigned, and that the blank in the bylaw be filled accordingly.

2. That a bylaw be passed levying the sum of \$19.92 as the County equivalent to the Legislative grant to Public Schools \$1860 and to Separate Schools \$132 for equipment and accommodation the same to be levied according to the act on those

portions of the county not included in urban school sections or attached thereto for school purposes.

3. That thirteen hundred and sixty eight 81/100 dollars (1368.81) be paid to Renfrew Collegiate Institute for excess maintenance on account of county pupils.

Report of Visitors to House of Refuge

Mr. Howe of the committee appointed to visit the House of Refuge at Perth, brought in and read the following report which on his motion, seconded by Mr. Cooke, was received and adopted.

TO THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE COUNTY OF RENFREW.

In compliance with a resolution adopted at the January session, we, your committee visited the Lanark County House of Refuge located at Perth on Friday last, the 12th instant.

We were conducted through the establishment by Mr. R. C. Tucker, the gentleman in charge, and every opportunity was afforded us to become acquainted with the arrangements throughout.

The buildings are ample and in a good state of repair and the general surroundings neat and tidy.

There are 65 inmates at present, 30 men, 32 women and 3 children. Of the adult inmates 10 are from this county. They all appear to be well cared for and they expressed themselves to us as being perfectly satisfied with the treatment they received.

Mr. and Mrs. Tucker are to be complimented for the very efficient manner in which they discharge their duties in the institution.

We found the closets constructed in such a manner that they are open and not self-flushers and were not in a good sanitary condition, but we were informed that the matter was receiving the attention of the Lanark County council.

The question of fire protection appears as yet to be in abey-

ance as there are no fire escapes or other life-saving appliances in evidence.

We incurred the following expenses in making our visit, viz., Geo. D. Biggs, \$9.35 and W. M. Howe, \$5.95.

Mr. Stuart, Chairman of the Roads and Bridges Committee, brought in and read the following report, which, on his motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas Gorman, was received and adopted.

TO THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE COUNTY OF RENFREW.

Your Committee on Roads and Bridges beg leave to report

as follows

1 On the application of the Reeve of Sebastopol for a grant of \$100 to aid in repairing a bridge across Hurd's Creek in that township and the application of the Reeve of Bagot and Blythefield for a grant of \$200 to aid in building a bridge on the Ashdod and Calabogie Road, we recommend that no action be taken.

2. We have examined the Darrell bridge and find it in a very unsafe condition.

2. That the duties of such Inspector shall be those laid down in the Public School Act 1901, the amendments thereto and in the regulations of the Education Department at Toronto now in force or hereinafter brought in force during the period of his engagement.

3. That the remuneration of the said Inspector hereby appointed shall be at the rate of \$800 per annum, with an allowance at the rate of \$400 per annum for travelling expenses, (exclusive of the Government grant,) and his actual outlay for postage, printing and stationery—payable monthly.

Bylaw No. 754.

To Divide the County of Renfrew for Purposes of Public School Inspection.

Whereas it has become necessary, owing to the number of Public Schools in said County now in existence, to divide the County into two inspectorates.

The Council of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew hereby enacts as follows :

1. That on, from and after the first day of January, A. D., 1909, the County of Renfrew shall be divided into two inspectorates for Public School purposes, and that such Division shall be according to the present Legislative Electoral divisions of the

County of Renfrew into the North Riding and South Riding, as provided by sub-section 6a of section 46 of Ontario Statutes 6, Edward VII., Chapter 53, and that each inspector shall have charge of all the Public Schools in the said Inspectorate as governed by said Electoral Division.

A Bylaw to levy upon the rural municipalities a sum equivalent to the special Legislative grant to the rural schools for "Equipment and Accommodation" for 1908; and to correct an error in the levy for general county purposes, June, 1907, by which the equivalent for special Legislative grants for 1906 and 1907 for the aforesaid purposes was levied upon the whole county instead of the rural municipalities only.

Whereas in the bylaw to levy a general rate for county purposes passed by this council June, 1907, the sum of \$4,138 was included therein as an equivalent to the special grant by the Legislature of \$2,069 in 1906 to the rural schools and a like amount for 1907, which said special Legislative grants and the equivalents thereto are, by Section 19, Chap. 51, Ont., 1907, amending Section 70, Chapter 139, Ont., 1901, payable only to rural schools and the equivalent is to be levied only upon each property as is not included in urban municipalities or annexed to any urban municipality for school purposes.

And whereas the proportion of the said \$4,138 wrongly levied upon the urban municipalities in June, 1907, amounts to \$1,189 and it is desirable that provision be made for a refund to the several municipalities concerned of the sums to which each is entitled not exceeding in all the said sum of \$1,189: and to levy the same upon the rural municipalities as provided by the Act of the Legislature hereinbefore mentioned.

And whereas the Legislative grant for the present year for the special purposes above designated is for Public Schools \$1,860 and for Separate Schools, \$132, total \$1,992, and it is necessary to levy upon the rural municipalities an equivalent to the said sum.

Therefore, the Council of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew hereby enacts:

- 1 That the following sums shall be refunded to the urban

municipalities they having been wrongly levied upon them as above set forth, viz:—

2 That the Clerks of the several rural municipalities in this county shall and they are hereby required to levy upon the whole rateable property of their respective municipalities (excepting such as may be annexed to any urban municipality for school purposes) in the manner provided by law, the sums set opposite the name of each such municipality, as hereinafter follows, and shall cause the same to be collected and paid over to their several local municipal treasurers, and the said local treasurers shall and they are hereby required to transmit the same to the county treasurer on or before the fifteenth day of December now next ensuing, that is to say, the amount in column numbered 1 which is the sum wrongly levied upon the urban municipalities in 1907, and the amount in the column numbered 2 which is the equivalent to the special Legislative grant for 1908, viz:—

For the Year 1907.

TO THE WARDEN AND MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL
OF THE COUNTY OF RENFREW.

Gentlemen,

Your auditors appointed to audit the books and vouchers of your treasurer for the year 1907, have carefully examined said books and vouchers for said year, and beg leave to report as follows:

(1) We found the books of your treasurer carefully and neatly kept and in good order, but we would recommend that a more systematic method for keeping the vouchers be provided, so as to make them more easily accessible to the auditors to enable them to perform their work more expeditiously.

(2) The total receipts for the year 1907 appear to be \$72,627.27 and the expenditure is shown to be \$72,769.48, leaving a balance to the credit of the treasurer of \$142.21.

(3) The total assets for the year as shown in the records appear to be \$73,524.79 and the total liabilities \$49,999.39, showing a surplus of assets of \$23,525.40.

(4) All items were properly vouched for except that there seems to be no official record to show the exact amount which the township of McNab should pay the county, as its share of the cost of building the Clay Bank bridge.

(5) We find the treasurer has been bonded in the London Guarantee and Accident Company, Limited, for twenty thousand dollars, for a period from February 1st, 1908, to February 1st, 1909, which we consider amply sufficient.

AWARD

In the Matter of Appeal by Certain Ratepayers of School Section No. 10, of the Township of Raglan from Bylaw No. 62, passed by the Council of said Township of Raglan.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME.

We, Dennis Joseph Donahue of the township of Pembroke, in the county of Renfrew, county court judge of the said county; Edwin Theodore White of the said town of Pembroke, inspector of public schools in and for the said county and George D. Biggs of the township of Alice, in the said county, farmer, send greeting:

Know ye that whereas Frank Bloom, C. F. Weland, Jacob Kellor, James D. Pinnock and six other ratepayers of school section No. 10, in the township of Raglan, in the county of Renfrew, made application in writing to the township council of the said township of Raglan requesting a division of school section No. 10 aforesaid, into two school sections, but without stating in what manner the said school section was to be divided

And whereas the said township council did in compliance with the request aforesaid, on the 4th day of March, 1908, pass a bylaw No. 62 whereby it divided the said school section into two school sections, one of such school sections to comprise all that portion of said school section No. 10 from concession 1 to 4 inclusive, all lots from 16 to 35 inclusive, of the said township of Raglan, and to be known as school section No. 11 of the township of Raglan, and the other of such school sections to consist of and comprise concessions 5 to 8 inclusive, and lots 16 to 35 inclusive of the said township of Raglan and to be known as school section No. 10

And whereas Wm. Weland, William J. Johnston, August Beanke and fifteen other ratepayers of said school section No. 10 appealed to the county council of the county of Renfrew to have the said bylaw No. 62 (by inadvertence and mistake called bylaw No. 63 in the application to said county council) set aside

And whereas the said county council did thereafter duly appoint us the said Dennis Joseph Donahue, Edwin Theodore White and George D. Biggs, arbitrators to hear the said appeal and to adjust and determine the matters complained of pursuant to the "Public Schools Act"

And whereas the said appeal was heard by the said arbitrators at the court house in the town of Pembroke on the 11th and 21st days of July, 1908

And whereas we the said arbitrators having taken on ourselves the burthen of the said arbitration and having heard and duly considered all the allegations and evidence of the said respective parties who came before us and of their counsel of and concerning said matters in difference and so referred to us as aforesaid do make and publish this our award in writing of and concerning the said matters so referred to us and do hereby award and determine that the said bylaw No. 62 of the council of the township of Raglan be and the same is hereby set aside with costs payable by the said corporation of the township of Raglan

And we further award and direct that the said corporation of the township of Raglan shall forthwith pay to Frederick Grozklags (who has paid the costs herein as agent for certain ratepayers of said school section No. 10) the costs of this arbitration which are hereby fixed at the sum of \$30.68, thirty dollars and sixty-eight cents
