

Bylaw No 108 - 1913

A Bylaw to appoint a Collector of Rates and Taxes for the year 1913

Whereas it is necessary to pass a Bylaw for the appointment of ~~the~~ ^{collectors} Rates and taxes for the year 1913

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Westmeath as follows

That Martin Beaupre, of the Township of Westmeath, be and is hereby appointed the Collector of Rates and taxes for the Township of Westmeath for the Year A.D. 1913 and that he be paid the sum of one hundred and ten dollars for his services as such

Know all men by these presents, that we Martin Beauprie

Collector of Rates for the Township of Westmeath

in the County of Renfrew, John Beauprie

of the Village of Beachburg in the Township

are jointly and severally held and firmly bound unto the Corporation of the Township

of Westmeath in the penal sum of

Ten Thousand dollars of lawful money of Canada, to be paid

to the Corporation of the said Township of Westmeath

and its successors, for which payment well and truly to

be made we jointly and severally bind ourselves, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators

firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our seals, and dated this 27th day of October

one thousand nine hundred thirteen

The Condition of this bond is such, that if the above bounden Martin

Beauprie shall collect all rates and assessments of the

Township of Westmeath for the year one thousand

nine hundred thirteen for which he has been appointed, and

shall pay over or cause to be paid over to the treasurer of the said Township

of Westmeath once (a) each week from the time that he

commences to collect said rates and assessments until the final return of the roll, the total amount collected

during the preceding week, the last instalment of the moneys collected by him, as aforesaid, to

be paid on or before the thirty first day of March

in the year one thousand nine hundred fourteen

or such other time as may be fixed by statute or by the council of the said Municipality, then the above bond

or obligation to be void, otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue.
