# COUNTY of RENFREW

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## Second Ordinary Session

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COUNCIL CHAMBERS, COURT HOUSE,

Pembroke, June 21st, 1921.

The County Court being in session on the day on which adjournment was made at the January session, it was deemed necessary to change the date to this day at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

The roll was called and all members found to be present and the Warden in the chair.

The minutes of the last day of the January session, they having been printed and circulated, were accepted as read and confirmed.

The Clerk then brought in and read the following communications, petitions, etc. :

From John Geale, Esq., Sec.-Treas. Board of Education, Renfrew, drawing the attention of the Council to an error made in the appointment of High School Trustee for the town of Renfrew at the January session.

\* From the Honorable the Minister of Public Works and Highways, acknowledging receipt of memorial re the amending of the Highways Improvement Act.

From the Honorable the Prime Minister of the Province of Ontario, acknowledging receipt of resolutions passed at the January session. ....

From the Honorable the Minister of Public Works and Highways Toronto, acknowledging receipt of resolution and memorial re route of Provincial Highway.

From John Carty, M.L.A., acknowledging receipt of resolution re the amending of the game and fishery laws; also petition asking for immediate designation of the Provincial Highway from Arnprior to Pembroke, and also the petition that the law be amended re County Councillors indemnity.

From the Deputy Minister of Public Works and Highways, acknowledging receipt of copy of resolution respecting the route of the Provincial Highway through Renfrew.

From the Deputy Minister of Public Works and Highways, copy of Order in Council approving of clause 2 of by-law 967 in respect to a road in the Township of Alice.

From the Department of Public Highways, acknowledging receipt of the Superintendent's annual returns, showing expenditures for work carried out on the County Road for the year 1921.

From the Sec.-Treas. Ontario Boards of Trade, enclosing copy of resolution adopted by that organization and presented to the Prime Minister of Ontario and the Minister of Agriculture re the appointing of a Lady Assistant or Teacher for every County in the Province to look after Women's Institute work, medical inspection of schools and courses in home nursing and household science.

From the Clerk of the County of Elgin, copy of petition to the Provincial Legislature and passed by the Elgin County Council, praying for the repeal of Section 12 of the Highways Improvement, 1920, re the right of County Councils appointing an Engineer to act as County Road Supt.

From the Deputy Minister of Education, calling the attention of this Council to the provisions of the statutes re maintenance grants to Continuation Schools at Pakenham.

From the Secretary to the Prime Minister of Ontario, acknowledging copy of resolution passed at January session re increased indemnity to County Councillors.

From the Minister of Public Works and Highways, re the amending of Section 460 of the Municipal Act and acknowledging receipt of copy of same.

From the Engineer of County Road Department of Public Highways, Toronto, enclosing statement showing the amount of Government grant due this County on expenditures carried out on County Roads during 1920, viz., \$128,986.24.

From Rev. Peter Bryce, Chairman Mothers' Allowance Commission, statement of claim in accordance with Section 8, Sub-section 2, of the Mothers' Allowance Act, dated April 15th and May 15th, 1921, for money paid to the beneficiaries during the months of March and April.

From the Deputy Minister of Public Highways, Toronto, advising that by-law No. 975 and the agreement respecting the grant to the town of Arnprior has been approved.

From Rev. Mr Quartermaine, order of commitment to Children's Aid Society of Emma Young, of Whitney, in the district of Nipissing.

From the Secretary-Treasurer of Association of Managers and Directors of the Homes for the Aged and Infirm, Dundas, Ont., asking for attendance at a meeting to be held at St. Thomas on June 28th and 29th, 1921.

From the Secretary of the School Board, Pakenham, calling the attention of this Council re the County's share for pupils from Renfrew County attending the Pakenham High School.

From Wilbert Brown, R. R. No. 3, Cobden, drawing the attention of Council that the award on the road between concessions one and two, W.M.L., and through lot 17, concession 2, require cleaning out.

From Sawyer Massey Co., Limited, Hamilton, soliciting orders for road machinery.

From the Deputy Minister of Education, advising of the amount of grant to the rural schools in the County on the basis of equipment and accommodations, viz., to Public Schools, \$1,713.31; Separate Schools, \$245.49; a total of \$1,958.80, to which this Council is by law required to add at least a sum equivalent to the above amount.

From the Chief Clerk of the Department of Public Highways, Toronto, advising that in pursuance of the provisions of Section 5 of the Provincial Highway Act the Department is depositing in the Registrar's office of the County of Renfrew a preliminary route plan showing the location of the road within the Townships of McNab, Horton, Ross, Westmeath and Pembroke, which is to be acquired as a Provincial Highway in accordance with the terms of the Provincial Highway Act, and advises that such highways shall be under the control of the Department of Public Highways at 12 o'clock noon on the 15th day of June, 1921.

From Rev. Mr Quartermaine, statement of amount due the Children's Aid Society of the County of Renfrew, for maintenance of children at the Shelter from January 1st to May 31st, 1921, viz., \$71.75.

From the President of the Ontario Municipal Association, Toronto, asking that this County become a member of that Association.

From Trevor H. Grout, Esq., Town Clerk, Arnprior, enclosing copy of resolution adopted by the Town Council of Arnprior, making application for a grant under the authority of Sec. 5, Sub-sections 1, and 7, of the Highway Improvement Act, towards the improvement of Elgin street, Arnprior.

From G. G. McNab, Esq., Chairman Mothers' Allowance, Local Board, County of Renfrew, enclosing copy of resolution adopted by that Board re the granting of \$50.00 per month to the Secretary, Miss Julia Mallon, of Pembroke.

From J. H. Reeves, Esq., Barrister, claiming damages for \$150 setting out that owing to the bad state of repair of the road where it crosses lots Nos. 1 and 2, in the 3rd concession, township of Pembroke. Mr. Harding's automobile went off the road causing damages to his automobile in the above amount.

From Trevor H. Grout, Esq., Town Clerk of Arnprior, enclosing an account for \$109.47 for interest on \$6,000.00 grant made by this County to town of Arnprior for elapsed time in payment.

### REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE.

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Mr Munroe, one of the members appointed to attend the Good Roads Convention at Toronto, brought in and read the following report which, on his motion, seconded by Warden Connolly, was received and adopted.

To the Warden and Council of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew.

Gentlemen,—

We, your Committee appointed to represent the County of Ren-

few at the Ontario Good Roads Convention at Toronto on March 2nd, 3rd and 4th, beg to report as follows :

Owing to illness, Mr Horace Russell, Reeve of McNab, was unable to attend but arranged with Warden Connelly to take his place.

On arriving at the Walker House, the first person we met was our friend, W. J. Moore, who thoughtfully had rooms reserved for us, and for which we desire to thank him before going further. Next, we met seven delegates from Leeds and Grenville, who informed us that each Township in their County had one representative.

Next morning a Reeve from the County of Frontenac told us that in his County six Townships were in the Good Roads System and the Reeve of each municipality was the Good Roads Committee, all of whom were present. These facts lead your Committee to think that Renfrew County is not over enthusiastic over good roads, which are so important to all of us, and although we do not see any direct remuneration in dollars and cents from such gatherings, were it not for such organizations we would never get anywhere, and only by our representative from each and every municipality can they be kept up. On arriving at the Assembly Hall of the Ontario Veterinary College on March 2nd, we found the meeting of the Engineers and County Road Superintendents not over and we enjoyed a very interesting and profitable illustrated lecture by Mr Mobre, Provincial Forester, on the planting, pruning of trees on our public highways, and also in our home grounds.

At 2 p.m. the Good Roads Convention opened and the time was taken up in the discussion of building of concrete roads, in which as yet we are not particularly interested.

Next morning Mr W. A. McLean, Deputy Minister of Highways, spoke on the building of good roads for the past twenty-five years, during which time he has been directly connected with the work and therefore is well qualified to speak with authority. One thing which struck us as a very true statement was that the only thing Mr McLean found permanent in roads was the maintenance, which began immediately a road was completed, something which was too often neglected.

On the evening of our banquet Mr F. C. Biggs, Minister of Public Works and Highways, in his address announced that he had that day received a cheque from the Dominion Government for \$203,000 as Ontario's share for good roads for 1920, which was the first money ever received from Ottawa for that purpose, which, said Mr Squires, 1st Vice-President of the Good Roads Association, would never have been but for the repeated efforts of that organization.



We had a short address from an Ontario boy, Dr. Pierce, of California, who was greatly interested in good roads in that state, where he had resided for many years.

He said in part they had started out to build roads with \$33,000,000, which only got them organized; they then raised forty millions more, and in all have spent over ninety millions, but they have roads, and he considers it the best investment the state ever made. Of course we must remember California has the climate, the fruit, and everything which draws the tourist, the pleasure seeker, and the idle rich, but Ontario has pleasures which they have not.

Many resolutions were passed, memorializing the Government for changes and new legislation concerning roads and municipal law, which I need not here mention, as no doubt you have all read them before now.

Gentlemen, I might make the report more lengthy, but as our time is valuable and no doubt you have all read the different addresses in the papers, it is unnecessary to continue further.

#### REPORT OF ENGINEER OF GOOD ROADS

Mr. Stewart, Chairman of Good Roads Committee, brought in and read the following report, which was received and placed on file:

To the Chairman, Good Roads Committee,  
County of Renfrew.

Dear Sir:—

I beg to make the following short report on the work which has been carried on under my supervision during 1921 up to the present.

#### Construction

(1) On Road No. 1.—We are continuing this as a gravel road from where we left off last year. We obtained gravel of a good quality from Thomas Haney, and up to date have finished over two miles of road and have rough gravel about 6 miles.

There are a number of culveras to be built here which I intend to get under way, and there is a hill section which we have passed over, but which will require some fairly heavy work. We have put in 7 pipe culverts so far. Foreman, Wm. Meek.

(2) On road No. 2 we have started grading from the junction of Road No. 96 and Road No. 2 and are making good progress. Foreman, J. B. McLaren.

It is my intention to shortly move the tractor, grader and crusher from Braeside to this section.

(3) Road No. 17—Slightly over one mile has been graded and 3 concrete box culverts have been built. This mile is now being surfaced with macadam and we expect to finish it this week. Foreman, John Dennison.

(4) Road No. 16—Slightly over a mile has been graded and 3 or 4 large pipe culverts installed. There was considerable rock work on the road. Foreman, John Dennison.

(5) Road No. 11—This road has been graded for a distance of about 1½ miles and the gravel surfacing will soon be finished. Foreman, Harry Barr.

(6) Road 96, Section 11, at Douglas. (a) The storm drains recently authorized have been installed, with the exception of placing the grates. Foreman, A. McEachen.

(b) Five pipe culverts and 2 box culverts have been built. Foreman, Sam Leech.

(c) About ¾ mile of roadway has been built from McCourt's Corner towards Douglas, and the crushing outfit has been moved back to John O'Neil's place, where it is now operating. Foreman, James Quilly.



(d) The location has been staked out across Agnew's, Wilson's and Neville's farms and grading work is now in progress. Foreman, Martin Rielly.

(7) Road 9. (a) A gravel road has been constructed from Northcote West for a distance of about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile. Foreman, E. E. Elcott.

(b) At Lot 12, Con. 3, Stafford, the road has been straightened to conform to the concession line and about  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile is under construction. Foreman, Garvel Wright.

(8) Road 18. Grading and surfacing with gravel is being carried on for about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile. Foreman, Joseph Lisk.

(9) Road 20. (a) This road is being graded and gravelled for  $1\frac{3}{4}$  miles from Davies' Mill north.

(b) In the Township of Alice grading and surfacing is being done. Foreman, Ellis Sparling.

(10) Road 13. (a) J. P. O'Meara, Adolph Schultz, Ferdinand Zadow and Fred Schwan are carrying on grading and surfacing

(b) Culverts are now being constructed.

(11) Road 12. John Buder is tile draining and surfacing with gravel.

(12) Road 96-17. (a) The surfacing of this road is being continued from where we left off last year. About one mile has been completed. Land has been obtained from Ed. Radtke and Richard Biggs to widen the road for 1,360 feet, and this piece was graded and culverts built. Foreman, R. W. Gibson.

(b) Grading operations are going on from Shady Nook southward. Foreman, Edward Leeney.

(b) Road 7. This road is being widened to 52 feet, graded and surfaced with gravel, and fair progress has been made. Foreman, Wm. Coffey.

(14) Road 8. Grading and surfacing with gravel is in progress. Foreman, John Ireton.

(15) Road 5. Grading and surfacing with gravel is in progress. Foreman, E. F. Bulmer.

### Bridges

Burnstown bridge has been finished, except for some minor details.

McGee Creek bridge is now under construction.

### Maintenance

Most of the patrol men have their sections in fair shape and a good many of them are carrying on special small works of improvement. I have seen most of the patrol men and have given instructions to all of them.

### General

It has been necessary for me to buy considerable light equipment to satisfy the demands of so many construction outfits.

Our machinery has been working satisfactorily, with the exception of the 20-40 Sawyer-Massey tractor at Pembroke, and the Cleveland tractor. These are apparently pretty well past the useful stage.

# BY-LAWS

## BY-LAW 987.

*To Amend By-law 922, being a By-law respecting the Improvement of Highways.*

WHEREAS By-law 922, passed the 20th day of June, A.D. 1918, has a Schedule A thereto attached forming part of said By-law, and the last paragraph of Road No. 2 on the first pages of said schedule reads as follows: "So far as this scheme is concerned the Township of McNab assumes one-half the cost of the share of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew of the maintenance of Burnstown bridge."

AND WHEREAS, under the said Improvement of Highways Act by all By-laws of the said Corporation upon obtaining the approval of the Minister of Highways the lands mentioned in said By-laws become vested in the said Corporation, including all bridges, and for the maintenance of which the Province repays to the said Corporation a certain percentage of such maintenance, and it is questionable whether the said Corporation has a legal claim upon the Township of McNab for any proportion of the cost of maintenance of said bridge, and it is deemed advisable to relieve the said Township from any liability or supposed liability.

AND WHEREAS said By-law 922 has received the approval of the Minister of Highways,

The Council of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew hereby enacts:

1. That said By-law 922 be amended by striking out of paragraph No. 2 of said Schedule A, the following words at the end of said Road No. 2: "So far as this scheme is concerned the Township of McNab assumes one-half the cost of the share of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew of the maintenance of the Burnstown bridge."

This By-law shall come into force upon the approval of the Minister of Highways for the Province of Ontario.

## BY-LAW No. 988.

*For the formation of a Village out of the District hereinafter particularly set out, being a part of the Township of McNab in the County of Renfrew.*

WHEREAS a Petition dated the First day of May, A.D. 1921, signed by 49 resident freeholders and 43 resident tenants, which resident tenants have been resident within the said district for at least four months next preceding the date of the said petition, and whose petitioners' names are entered on the last revised assessment roll for the said Township of McNab, said petitioners constituting at least one half of the freeholders and resident tenants whose names are entered on the last revised assessment roll for the said Township of McNab has been presented to the Council of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew praying for the erection of the district fully set out in said petition and in this By-law into a Village.

AND WHEREAS the said petition states and the fact is that the said district has a population of not less than 750 and the area of the said district is not more than 500 acres, obviating the necessity of a census being taken.

AND WHEREAS at the January 1921 Sessions of the Council of the Corporation of the said County, a notice of motion was given of the intention of the Council to take into consideration said petition and the passing of a by-law for the formation of a Village out of the district hereinbefore and hereinafter specially set out, pursuant to sub-section 5 of section 13 of the Municipal Act.

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew hereby enacts:

1. That the following district, being part of the Township of McNab in the County of Renfrew, and heretofore being the same lands which formed the boundaries and limits of the Police Village of Braeside as laid down and shown on a plan thereof drawn by Morris and Moore and dated the 9th day of December A.D. 1910, and which lands are described as follows:

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the Township of McNab, in the County of Renfrew, in the Province of Ontario, and being composed of Lots Eight (8), Nine (9), Ten (10), and Eleven (11), in Concession Fourteen and part of lots Eight (8), Nine (9), Ten (10), Eleven (11), Twelve (12), and Thirteen (13) in Concession Thirteen, in the aforesaid Township of McNab, which said parcel or tract of land may be better known and described as follows that is to say:—Commencing at a post planted at the intersection of the high-water mark of the Ottawa River and the side line

between lote Eight (8), and Nine (9) in Concession Fourteen, at a distance of Fifteen chains and twenty-six links and seven-tenths of a link (15, 267 ch's) from the East side of the road allowance between Concessions Thirteen and Fourteen, measured North Fifty-nine degrees and Twenty-nine minutes East (n. 59 29'E.) mag.; Thence along the aforesaid side-line between lots Eight (8) and Nine (9) South Fifty-nine degrees and Twenty-nine minutes West (s. 59 29'W.) mag. a distance of Sixteen chains and twenty-six links and seven-tenths of a link (16.267 ch's) to an iron bolt planted on the West side of the road allowance between Concessions Thirteen and Fourteen; thence South thirty degrees and five minutes East (s. 30 05'E) mag. along the West side of the said road allowance a distance of twenty-two chains and eighty-three links and eight-tenths of a link (22.838 ch's.) to an iron bolt planted on the West side of the said road allowance; thence South fifty-nine degrees and forty-two minutes West (s. 59 42'W) mag. a distance of four chains and ninety-three links and eight-tenths of a link (4.938 ch's) to an iron bolt; thence South twenty-nine degrees and forty minutes East (s. 29 40'E) mag. a distance of seven chains and forty-five links and nine-tenths of a link to an iron bolt planted on the side-line between lots Seven (7) and Eight (8); thence South fifty-nine degrees and thirty-five minutes West (s. 59 35'W) mag. along said side-line a distance of four chains and twenty-four links and five-tenths of a link (4.245 ch's.) to an iron bolt planted at the intersection of the side line, between lots Seven (7) and Eight (8), with the Easterly boundary of the Canadian Pacific Railway's right-of-way; thence North-westerly along the said Easterly boundary of the C.P.R. right-of-way a distance of ninety-two chains and seventeen links and four-tenths of a link to a post planted at the intersection of the aforesaid right-of-way boundary and the North side of the road allowance between lots Ten (10) and Eleven (11) in Concession Thirteen; thence South fifty-nine degrees and forty-six minutes West (s. 59 46'W.) mag. along the said North side of road allowance a distance of thirty-four chains and thirty-four links and two-tenths of a link to an iron bolt planted at the intersection of the said North side of road allowance and the extreme Westerly limits of the present Village of Braeside produced South-easterly to intersect the aforesaid boundary; thence North twenty-six degrees and forty-four minutes West (N. 26 44'W.) mag. along the aforesaid limits produced a distance of seventy-one chains and sixty links (71 60 ch's.) to an iron bolt planted on the side line between the properties of John A. Gillies and the John Connell Estate; thence North sixty-one degrees and sixteen minutes East (N. 61 16'E.) mag. along the said side line a distance of fifteen chains and seventy-eight links and one-half a link (15.785 ch's.) to an iron bolt planted at the South-west corner of the property belonging to Edward Lovely; thence North twenty-eight degrees and forty-four minutes West (N. 28 44'W). mag. at right angles to the aforesaid side line a distance of nineteen chains and nineteen links (19.19 ch's.) to an iron bolt planted at the side line between lots Thirteen (13) and Fourteen (14) Concession Thirteen; thence North Sixty-one degrees and sixteen minutes East (N. 61 16'E.) mag. along the said side line a distance of 10 chains and sixteen



links and one-half a link (10.165 ch's.) to a post planted at the high-water mark of the Ottawa River; thence downstream along the Easterly bank of the Ottawa River to the point of commencement and containing by admeasurement four hundred and seventy-five acres and six-tenths of an acre (475.69 acres) be the same more or less, is hereby created into a Village called "the Village of Braeside" in the County of Renfrew.

2. The expenses of this by-law, the necessary copies thereof, of the publishing of the notice required by sub-section 6 of said section 13, and of other necessary expenditure for the completion of said district into a Village incurred by this Council shall be paid to Clerk of said County by said petitioners.

3. The incorporation shall take effect on the 31st day of December, 1921, next after the publication of the notice mentioned in clause 2 of this by-law.

4. The place for holding the first election shall be at the Orange Hall in the Police Village foof Braeside and Alexander Derenzy of the said Police Village is hereby appointed Returning Officer and who shall perform all the duties in connection with the election which in other cases are to be performed by the Clerk of a local Municipality, and shall act as Clerk of the new Municipality until a Clerk is appointed and has taken the oath of office.

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*A By-law to Equalize for County Purposes the Assessment Rolls of the Local Municipalities, in the County of Renfrew, for 1920.*
