(c) In that portion of the Province lying north of the main line of the Canadian National Railway (formerly the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway) from Quebec to the Manitoba boundary line, from October 10th to November 5th, both days inclusive.

The Committee further advise that pursuant to the provisions of Clause (c) of the same sub-section, no person shall kill or have in possession in any one day during the open season now provided, birds in excess of the numbers set forth as follows:-

and that the birds so taken shall be disposed of either as an article of food or mounted, not later than ten days after the close of the open season now provided for divisions (a), (b) and (c), failing which, permit to authorize possession of such birds after such respective dates must be procured from the Department of Game and Fisheries.

In further reference to our conversation to-day we wish to advise you that we telephoned Mr. Rudd's office and they advised us that they expected him, but up until 5.15 he had not called. I am writing him tonight asking when he will be in Town.

In going over the figures I make it as follows:

Stock destroyed in rear warehouse	\$915.54
Other contents	441.00
on which there is insurance of \$300.00 on contents and \$50.00 on ordinary contents.	

According to the information given us to-day by Mr. Collins, he is prepared to place the amount of stolen goods at \$900.00. Deduct this from the value of stock in the storehouse which adjoins and communicates with the store proper, leaves a value of \$14,626.68. Of this a considerable percentage, according to Mr. Collins, was removed at the time of the fire and as Mr. Collins states that he is quite convinced that the amount stolen exceeds \$900.00 we are suggesting the sum of \$731.33, which is 5% of \$14,626.68, making a total of \$1,631.33. Added to this is \$150.00 for the loss to the building in the rear, \$350.00 on stock and contents of all kinds and \$146.55 for damage to the main building, making a total of \$2,277.88.
