

By-law No. 989

A by-law to submit a question to
the Public Schools Supporters

WHEREAS Council of the Corporation of
the Village of Cobden have received from the
School Board of the School Section which includes
the said Village of Cobden and S. S. No. 10 of the
adjoining Township of Ross, a petition, praying
that the Council of the said Village of Cobden
borrow up to \$95,000 and issue and sell debentures
therefore, for the purposes of erecting a new
Public School.

AND WHEREAS Sec. 56 of The Public
Schools Act, R. S. O. 1950 provides that where the
Council refuses to pass such by-law, the question
shall be submitted to a vote of the electors qualified
to vote on money by-laws and who are Public
School supporters.

AND WHEREAS the Council has refused to
pass such by-law and the said School Board has
requested that a vote be taken of the said electors
on the question.

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation
of the Village of Cobden enacts as follows:-

1: That a vote be taken of the electors
of the Village of Cobden and S. S. No. 10 of the
Township of Ross (as provided in Sec. 58 of the
Public Schools Act) qualified to vote on money
by-laws, and who are supporters of the Public School
on the following question.

Are you in favour of the Village of Cobden borrowing and issuing debentures for an amount up to \$95,000 for the purpose of erecting a new Public School.

2: That the said vote be taken on Wednesday the 28th day of December 1955 between the hours of eleven o'clock in the forenoon and seven o'clock in the afternoon.

3: That J. A. Sammon be and he is hereby appointed the Returning officer to take the said vote and sum up the results thereof.

4: That the Memorial Hall in the said Village of Cobden be and it is hereby designated the poll for taking the said vote.

5: That J. A. Sammon shall so sum up the vote at his office on Main Street in the Village of Cobden on Friday the 29th day of December 1955 at
