March 2<sup>nd</sup> 1872

Pursuant to adjournment the municipal Council  
 of the Township of Ross met at the Town hall  
 Colden on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1872

A full council present - The Reeve presiding.  
 Minutes of the previous meeting were read and  
 confirmed. Mr. Keill gives notice that he  
 will at the present sitting of Council introduce  
 a Bylaw for fixing the amounts to be paid for  
 Shop and Tavern licenses for the year 1872

Moved by Robert Reilly & seconded by William  
 Ross. that John Reynolds receive an order on  
 the Treasurer for the sum of \$35<sup>00</sup> per  
 pay for assessing and collecting for the year 1871

(Carried)

Two certificates were read from the Tavern inspector William Wallace sen<sup>r</sup>, stating that Mr. Erastus Huntington & Mr. John Crawford were entitled to receive licences they having all the accomodations the law requires

It <sup>was</sup> moved by Robert Reilly & seconded by William Ross that this Council grant a license <sup>to John Crawford</sup> to keep a Tavern in Colden for the year 1872 & until the 1<sup>st</sup> March 1873

(Carried)  
Moved by Robert Reilly & seconded by William Ross that a licence be granted to Erastus Huntington to keep a Tavern <sup>in the house</sup> for the year 1872 & until 1<sup>st</sup> March 1873

Moved by William Ross, and seconded by Robert Reilly that \$15<sup>00</sup> be granted to repair the bridge at the Town line <sup>at Mr. Frasers</sup> if Westmeath Council grant an equal sum.

(Carried)  
Moved by Dawson Elliott & seconded by Robert Reilly that the Commissioner be authorized to examine the Bridge on the Wagon road, at John Lee's House, & have it repaired - Carried.

Moved by Dawson Elliott & seconded by John Hill sen<sup>r</sup> that Bylaw No 147 for fixing the amount of Tavern and shop licenses be brought forward and read a first time Carried

It was then read a first time  
Moved by John Hill sen<sup>r</sup> & seconded by Dawson Elliott that the bylaw just read be read a second & third time short and passed (Carried)

It was then read a second & third time short and passed in conformity with the above resolution

Moved by Robert Reilly & seconded by William Ross that the sum of \$20<sup>00</sup> be granted by this Council if Westmeath Council grant the same amount for the purpose of building a bridge on the Town line that was burned last year between John Wilson's & Doctor Black's (Carried)

Moved by William Ross and seconded by Robert Reilly that an order be granted in favour of John Reynolds for \$20.90 for collecting school money - Carried.

Moved by Dawson Elliott and seconded by John Hill that the bridge on the road leading to Mr. Byces & the bridge at Mr. McKays be built & that the Commissioner be authorized to let out the job immediately - Carried -

Moved by Robert Reilly & seconded by John Hill that this Council do grant the sum of \$100<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of finishing the bridge around the head of the Mustkrat Lake Carried

Moved by Dawson Elliott & seconded by Robert Reilly that this Council do now adjourn until the first Saturday in May 1872 at the hour of 10<sup>o</sup> clock forenoon. being a Court of revision - Carried -
