brought forward and be read a first time (Carried)

Moved by Dawson Elliott and Seconded by William Ross that the Bylaw No 149 for laying a rate for the year 1872 be brought forward and read a second and third time short and passed
(Carried)

The aforesaid Bylaw for laying a rate of six mills in the dollar on the whole of the rateable property of the Township of Ross was read a first, second, and third time short and passed in conformity with the aforesaid resolutions.
