

Town Hall May 29th 1875
Pursuant to notice published in the
Pembroke Standard the Council of
Ross Met as a Court of Revision on 3rd May
1875 The Reeve and all the Members
present except Mr. Hill. The Reeve in
the Chair

There was only one case brought up for exam-
-ination. James B. Marshall complained
of being too high assessed on Real Property
and that his personal property was exempt
-pt from tax. The Assessment was sustained
by the Court and ordered to remain
as it appears on Rolls as there was no alter-
-ations made on Rolls. It was moved by ^{one} Robert
Reilly and seconded by Mr John Craft that
the Rolls as returned by the Assessor be confirmed
by this Court of Revision. (Carried)

The Council then adjourned until One
O'clock. Pursuant to adjournment the Council
met at One O'clock all the Members present

The Municipal Council then comman-
ced the General business of the Township

The Reeve presiding,

Minutes of former Meeting
were read approved of and signed by
the Reeve. Moved by Mr Craft seconded
by Mr Reilly that the Road Commissioner
be instructed to have Cedars laid on the
Ground to build a bridge on Mill Creek
near Cobden (Carried)

Moved by Mr Cartman seconded by Mr
Craft that Mr Reilly be authorized to
procure one acre of Cedar for the use of this
Corporation (Carried)

Moved by Mr Cartman Seconded by Mr Reilly
that Francis Neil be allowed to perform
his Statute Labor on Blanks between 3rd & 4th
Concessions to Proving Line (Carried)

Moved by Mr Reilly and Seconded by Mr
Cartman, That James M^r Laughlan be path
master instead of Patrick M^r Dermott who
was left from that beat (Carried)

Moved by Robert Reilly Seconded by Mr Graff
that John Reynolds receive and order for
\$45.⁰⁰ for collecting for 1874 and \$40.⁰⁰
for assessing for 1875 (Carried)

Moved by Mr Graff Seconded by Mr Reilly
that Robert Hill receive and Order for
\$32.⁵⁰ part salary for 1875 (Carried)

Moved by Mr Reilly Seconded by Mr Cartman
that this Council do now adjourn until
the second Saturday in August (Carried)
