Salary as Commissioner for 1875. Carried

Stationery and other expenses necessarily incurred  
by him such as Travelling &c. Carried

also the sum of \$1.<sup>75</sup> for work on Lees Bank Carried

an opening in certain lots on and six leading  
into the Mustant Lake and the said Carried

not to exceed thirty dollars. Carried.
