Pursuant to adjournment the municipal council of the township of Ross met in the Town Hall Cobden on the 22nd day of March 1877. A special Council pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Act was held at the time of the meeting and signed by the Mayor and a petition was presented drafted by another party praying for the Council to grant them some money on the 5th concession.

Also a petition from the Church and others praying the Council would grant them some money on the 4th concession line of the Township of Ross from lot 15 to lot 16. And a petition from Robert Gould and others praying the Council to grant some money on the 4th concession from the crossing line between lots 20 & 21 to James Logan.

Moved by Mr. Murdoch seconded by Mr. Cook that the Road Commission be instructed to go and see the 5th concession for by Mr. Appleby on the 5th concession.

Moved by Mr. Cook seconded by Mr. Appleby that the Road Commission be instructed to go and see the Road between the 4th and 5th concessions from lot 16 to lot 15 as petitioned for by George Clark and others.

Moved by Mr. Cook seconded by Mr. Appleby that the Road Commission be instructed to examine the road between the 4th and 5th concessions from the crossing line between lots 20 & 21 to James Logan.

Moved by Mr. Appleby seconded by Mr. Cook that Joseph Appleby present on side on the 5th concession for the sum of twenty five dollars on roads.

Moved by Mr Cook seconded by Mr Murdock that Mr John Howie Notify all parties and Concessionaires from Town Line of Ross to lot B. 21 to remove all fences and other obstructions that they may have put up and that all necessary work be done by three public notices to that effect. Carried

Moved by Mr Cook seconded by Mr Murdock that Martin Gorman be exempt from Municipal Taxes for the year 1878. Carried

Moved by Mr McCaskill seconded by Mr Craff that Michael Fletcher be exempt from Taxes for the year 1878. Carried

Moved by Mr Craff seconded by Mr Cook that the Road Commission go and examine the Road as petitioned for by James Peever and others and report at the June sitting of Council. Carried

Moved by Mr Murdock seconded by Mr Craff that Thomas Faught get an order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$1.⁰⁰ for overcharge on Taxation for the year 1878. Carried

Moved by Mr Murdock seconded by Mr Cook that William May be appointed Surveyor in place of John Kerr. Resigning. Carried

Moved by Mr Murdock seconded by Mr Craff that James McAlister receive an order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$2.²⁵ for Statute Labour charged agst James Smith he having received a Certificate for the said amount. Carried

Moved by Mr McCaskill seconded by Mr Murdock that Edward Luffey receive an order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$4.⁰⁰ for getting legal advice. Carried

Moved by Mr McCaskill seconded by Mr Craff that the Corporation of Ross do grant the sum of \$20.⁰⁰ to be expended on the cut on the Lower line between Westmeath and Ross as granted by the Westmeath Council. Carried

Moved by Mr Graff seconded by Mr Murdoch that John Delahy receive an order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$ 2.²⁵ for Civil flour given Widow McNaughton Carried.

Moved by Mr Graff seconded by Mr Murdoch that John R. McDonald receive an order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$ 7.²⁵ for work done on Town Hall. Carried.

Moved by Mr Cook seconded by Mr Murdoch that the proceedings of Ross Council be published in the Pembroke Standard and also in the Observer. Carried.

Moved by Mr Graff seconded by Mr McEasick that the Corporation of Ross do grant the sum of \$10.⁰⁰ to be expended on the Town line between Bromley & Ross opposite lots 11 & 12 of Ross providing Bromley grants the same amount. Carried.

Moved by Mr Graff seconded by Mr McEasick that Bylaw No 3 for the purpose of separating school section No 1 be brought up and read the first time. Carried.

Moved by Mr Cook seconded by Mr Graff that an order be drawn on the Treasurer in favour of the Pembroke Standard for the sum of \$14.⁰⁰ for printing Voters Lists &c. Carried.

Moved by Mr Graff seconded by Mr Murdoch that the Petition of Dudley Moore and others lay over until next sitting of Council. Carried.

Moved by Mr Cook seconded by Mr Murdoch that Bylaw Number 3 for the separation of school section No 1 be brought up and read a second and third time short and passed. Carried.

The aforesaid Bylaw was read a first second and third time short and passed according to the above resolution.

Moved by Mr Graff seconded by Mr Cook that the Rev George Black receive an order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$4.⁵⁰ due him as fees for three meetings of Council. Carried.

Moved by Mr McEasick seconded by Mr Graff that this Council do now adjourn to meet again

on last Saturday in April at Foresters Falls
at the hour of ten o'clock A.M. "Carried"

Moved by Mr Murdock seconded by Mr Cook that Robert Hill Sp. Clerk call a new election for the elect a Reve in the place or stead of George Black who is now in Manitoba and cannot act as such Reve. "Carried"

Moved by Mr McCastill seconded by Mr Cook that John Hewie receive an order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$1.50 for putting up notice and notifying parties personally on the disputed Gorman line. "Carried"

Moved by Mr McCastill seconded by Mr Cook that Robert Murdock receive an order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$1.50 for
