Carried Moved by Mr Cooke and seconded by Mr Humphries that R C Millars offer be accepted for the printing of the Minutes of the Ross Council for the year 1880 for the sum of ten dollars (Carried

Moved by Mr Cooke seconded by Mr Humphries that S E Mitchells account lie over till we get information about it and that the Clerk be instructed to write to him ascertain when we received items amounting to \$13.42 As we acknowledge the remainder of Acct

Carried Moved by Mr Cooke seconded by Mr Humphries that an order be drawn in favor of John Horrie for the sum of \$40 six dollars & forty cents - for the widow Dillabonghs taxes which have been accepted by Council

Carried Moved by Mr Cartman seconded by Mr Jameson that John Horrie receive an order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$13.46 being for taxes struck off Mr Sulchriest, taxes it being an error

Moved by Mr Jamison seconded by Mr Cartman that the Clerk notify the County Treasurer that the tax charged against lot no 21 in the 8th con for the year 1876 is a mistake and that the amt against it be struck off the Books Carried

Moved by Mr Cartman seconded by Mr Jamison that Thomas Dracou receive an order on the treasurer for the sum of \$3.00 being for legal advise concerning the disputed Gorman line Carried

Moved by Mr Cooke seconded by Mr Jamison that the time for receiving the Collectors Roll be extended to the fifteenth of March Carried

Moved by Mr Cartman seconded by Mr Humphris that this council do now adjourn to meet again on the third Saturday in March next at the hour of ten o'clock AM at the Town Hall Cobden Carried
