

Council Room November 13th 1880

Pursuant to adjournment the Municipal Council of the Township of Ross met in the Town Hall at Ross on the 13th day of November 1880 a full Council present - the Resolutions of former Meeting were read approved of and Signed by the Reeve & Clerks

A Letter was read from William Rosch stating that the Bridge at Olmsted's old mill was in a very dangerous condition. Also an account from Bromley Council showing the Costs of Survey of Town Line between Westmeath Bromley & Ross, and a Petition from Wm. M^{rs} Hector and others was also read.

Moved by Mr. Humphries seconded by Mr. Jamieson that the Road Commissioner be instructed to go and see the old Olmsted Bridge and have it repaired as soon as possible. (Carried)

Moved by Mr. Jamieson seconded by Mr. Cook that the Bromley Council receive an order on the for the sum of \$9.24 being Ross's share of the survey between Ross Bromley & Westmeath. (Carried)

Moved by Mr. Cook seconded by Mr. Humphries that the Petition of Wm. M^{rs} Hector and others lay over until the second meeting of Council in 1881. (Carried)

David Cook gives notice that he will at the present sitting of Council introduce a Bylaw for authorizing the payment of certain sums of money mentioned therein.

Moved by Mr. Cook seconded by Mr. Jamieson that an order be drawn in favor of Robert Ricky for the sum of \$59.95 for Brushing and cleaning the Road on the Sixth Concession between lots eight and ~~seven~~.

Moved by Mr. Cartman seconded by Mr. Humphries that Duncan M^{rs} Owen receive an order

on the Treasurer for the sum of \$10.00 for Stumping
Road Allowance on the 2nd Concession near Albert-
Olmsted's. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Cook Seconded by Mr.
Jamieson that an order be drawn in favor of
Daniel Holt for the sum of \$6.⁹⁵ for laying
Plank on Forestier's Falls Bridge. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Cartman Seconded by Mr.
Jamieson that Bylaw No 4 for the purpose of paying
certain sums of money mentioned therein be brought
up and read the first time. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Cook Seconded by Mr.
Humphries that Bylaw No 4 for the purpose of
paying certain sums of money mentioned therein
be brought up and read a second & third time short
and passed. Carried.

the Bylaw was read a first-second

and third time short & passed.

Moved by Mr. Cartman Seconded by Mr.
Cook that this Council do now adjourn to meet again
on the third Saturday in November next at
Forestier's Falls at the hour of 10.0. Clock A.M. Carried.
