Moved by Mr Jamieson seconded by Mr Cartman that the Road Commissioner be instructed to sell the old Bridge at Forests Falls by public auction. (Carried)

Moved by Mr Humphries seconded by Mr Jamieson that one 1/2 barrel of Flour be given Mrs M. Thompson she being an indigent. (Carried)

Moved by Mr Locke seconded by Mr Humphries that the widow McDonald on the Lucas Road be exempt from taxes for the year 1887. (Carried)

Moved by Mr Cartman seconded by Mr Jamieson that this Council do now adjourn to meet again on the last Saturday in February at the hour of 10 o'clock A.M. (Carried)
