

Townhall Cobden March 31<sup>st</sup> 1885

Pursuant to agreement, the Council met in Town hall on the above mentioned date the Rouse and all the Councilors present. Mr. Jamison took the necessary oath of office and took his seat the minutes of former meeting were read approved of and signed by the Rouse and Clerk

Moved by Mr. Cook and seconded by Mr. Humphreys that the Clerk be instructed to notify the Road Commission to let a job of building a <sup>stone</sup> Culvert on Coye line between the 5 & 6 range near <sup>+</sup>proof line between <sup>lots</sup> 15 and 16

Moved by Mr. Cook and seconded by Mr. Humphreys that James Grant sh. be allowed to do his statutory labour on the 10<sup>th</sup> Con line in front of lot No 4 and that the Pathmaster inspect said labour

Moved by Mr. Cook and seconded by Mr. Jamison that the Clerk be instructed to notify the Road Commission to build a bridge on the Quins Road over what is known as Bottoms gully

Moved by Mr. Cook and seconded by Mr. Jamison that the Clerk instruct the Road Commission to examine the bridge near Mr. Lee on the Forest line and if it is dangerous to have it repaired

Moved by Mr. Jamieson and second by Mr. Humphreys that the Auditors Report be accepted Carried

Moved by Mr. Jamieson and second by Mr. Humphreys that a grant of \$60 be given to the Agricultural Society of Ross and Bowler for the purpose of assisting to fence the agricultural grounds in Collier's Mill (accounting from said Motion) Carried

Moved by Mr. Cartman and second by Mr. Jamieson that bylaw No. 2 be brought up and read a second time and that the blanks be filled in with the different amounts and orders be drawn on the Treasury for the same Carried
