

Cobden May 3rd 1884

The court of revision for the township of Ross was held in the town hall Cobden on the above mentioned day the Rev. Mr. McCall in the chair compilers all present

Moved by Mr. Jamison and seconded by Mr. Delaney that \$400 be struck off A. L. Jamison's assessment on his clavators carried

Moved by Mr. Jamison and seconded by Mr. Humphreys that the followings changes be made on the assessment roll viz that James Ross name be struck off the roll and John Moore be entered instead and that the property now assessed to John Moore be assessed to Stephen Moore that the property assessed to W. S. Colman being part of lot 4 in 5 con. be assessed to George Flood that Hugh & Robert Ritchey be assessed in partnership that Thomas Forman's name be struck off the roll and Edward & Joseph Warren be assessed for the property that Robert Ward's name be struck off and Thomas Reits be assessed Duncan McLean's name be struck off and Robert & Duncan Jd. be assessed that 2nd of lot 401 in the 2 con be struck Matthew Major's assessment and William Peterson assessed that Daniel Wil's name be struck off and Robert Allen assessed for the same carried

Court of revision closed and opened on the general business of the township

Moved by Richard Humphreys and seconded by Wm. Jamison that the commutation for statute labor be one dollar per day carried

Moved by Mr. McAlister and seconded by Mr. Humphreys that E. J. Len be allowed his labour on proof line between A. & B. in first con carried

Moved by Mr. Jamison and second by Mr. McAlister that this Council exempt Mr. John M. Luce from tax for the term of five years on a saw and shingle mill to be erected by him at or near his first mill on lot 8 in 8 con Ross in consideration that he has said mill erected & running on or before the first of May 1855 & that said mill be occupied & worked by him during said term of exemption Carried

Moved by Mr. Jamison & second by Mr. Delaney that the sum of forty dollars be granted to purchase planks for repairing side walk in the village of Cobden Carried

Moved by Mr. Delaney & second by Mr. Jamison that Mr. Cashman be allowed the privilege of occupying one half of Pembroke st. opposite the brick yard for the purpose of drying brick Carried

Moved by Mr. Delaney & second by Mr. McAlister that a vote be drawn on the treasury in favor of Edward Gibson for the sum of \$10.00 for work done on road across the head of Muskat Lake Carried

Moved by Mr. Jamison & second by Mr. Humphreys that the Road Commissioners be instructed to let out the following jobs on roads cutting down hill on profile between lots 10 & 11 in 12 con expenditure not to exceed \$20 filling in approaches to bridge on profile between 5 & 6 in 7th con not to exceed \$15.00 repairing cross lay around Muskat Lake expenditure not to exceed \$100.00 repairing road between lot 14 & 19 in 4th con and Jefferys creek on the Hickey station road expenditure not to exceed \$60.00 Carried

Moved by Mr. Jamison & second by Mr. McAlister that Thos. M. Gun Sathmarin make a concave in front of porch on lot 10 on front line & that James Hill perform his statute labor upon him Carried

Moved by Mr. Garrison & second by Mr. Delaney
that Delosma Brown John Ross & ~~Richard~~
Humphreys be appointed members of the local board
of health for the township of Ross Carried

Moved by Mr. Delaney and second by Mr. Humphreys
that this Council do now adjourn to meet
again on the first Saturday in July Carried
