

Town Hall, Cobden  
26<sup>th</sup>. October 1889

The Municipal Council of the Township of Ross, met in the Town Hall, Cobden on the above date, for the transaction of the general business of the Township. The Reeve in the Chair, Councillors all present. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved of and signed by the Reeve and Clerk.

Mr Delaney gives notice that he will at this present meeting of Council introduce a By Law for the purpose of paying out certain sums of money.

Moved by Mr Delaney and seconded by Mr Bulmer that By Law No. 54, for the purpose of paying out certain sums of money be now brought up and read a first-time. Carried.

Moved by Mr Delaney and seconded by Mr Bulmer that By Law No. 54, for the purpose of paying out certain sums of money be now brought up and read a second time, and the blanks filled in with the different names and amounts as follows and orders drawn on the Treasurer for the same.

Francis Crozier paper scrapers	\$ 2.50
Thos Burton repairing roads	5.88
Mr Rose, absenters statute labor performed by him	4.00

Moved by Mr ~~Bulmer~~ <sup>Rose</sup> and seconded by Mr McWhiter that By Law No. 54 be now brought up and read a third time short and passed. Carried.

Moved by Mr Bulmer and seconded by Mr McAlister that James Freeland be allowed his next years Statute Labor for the digging of ditch along, proving him as his swamps. Carried

Mr Bulmer has reported that he had let contract for the building of Bridge over Creek near Mr McLaughlin, to Geo. Verblint for the sum of eighty nine dollars, work to be completed on or before the 10<sup>th</sup> June 1890.

Moved by Mr Delaney & seconded by Mr McAlister that Mr Bulmer be, and he is hereby appointed to ~~supervise~~ oversee the building of the said Bridge near Mr McLaughlin. Carried.

Moved by Mr Delaney and seconded by Mr Bulmer, that the Recm examine the Bridge near Mr Majors at the head of Gibsons Lake and have any necessary repairs made. Carried.

Moved by Mr Delaney and seconded by Mr McAlister that this Council do now adjourn, to meet again on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1889. Carried.
