The Municipal Council of the Township
of Ross met in the Town Hall on 27th June 1891
for the transaction of the general business
of the Township. The Rev. in the Chair,
Councillors all present, minutes of pre-
vious meeting read and approved,
and signed by the Rev. & Clerk.

Mr Bulmer gives notice, that he will at

a By Law for the purpose of Licensing
Transient Traders.

Mr McAllister gives notice

sums of money.

Moved by Mr McAllister & Sec by Mr Rose
that an order be granted on Treasurer
in favor of Mr Frederick ^{of the sum of} \$100, ~~200~~ ⁵⁰
dollars being tax on Lot 5th 16, 2nd Corner
the said sum having been collected twice.

Mr Hugh Gilmer having complained that parties are drawing away sand from the Hill on Snowing Line near James Ferguson and rendering the road dangerous. Moved by Mr Bulmer & seconded by Mr Bell that the Road Commissioners have notices put up forbidding all persons from digging holes in the Snowing Line, by taking road sand out of the road between Lots 10 & 11. in the 5th Concession. Carried.

Mr Little having complained that parties owning farms in the 6th Concession, have fenced across the 5th Concession Line.

Moved by Mr McAlister & seconded by Mr Bell, that the Clerk is hereby authorized to notify, all parties obstructing by fence or otherwise, said Concession Line. to remove said fences or obstructions at once. Carried.

Moved by Mr Bell & seconded by Mr McAlister that the Clerk. Notify Mr Charles Frost, to stumps & make passable that part of Road between Old Road from Albert Olinsteads to 1st Conⁿ Line or on his refusal or neglect to do so, that he open up the old road which he has fenced across. Carried.

Moved by Mr Rose & 2^d by Mr Bulmer, that the Road Com^r be instructed to give out Contracts to open up and repair the following roads & Bridges the expenses not to exceed the amounts opposite each.

- (1) Deepening ditches at Str^o McLaurens \$5.00
- (2) Repairing bridge on Queen's Line at Mr McWade's \$20.00
- (3) Opening up Snowing Line between Henry Elliott's Corner and the road at John Hills \$60.00
- (4) Opening up the 5th Concession Line between M Laughlins, S. House & Michael Gormans \$50.00

- (5) Rep. Cross roads at No. 1 S. House \$10.00
(6) Rep. Road on Hill at The Ross \$5.00

That a grant of ten dollars be made for
the purpose of repairing side walk in
Trout Falls. — Carried —

Moved by Mr. Rubner seconded by Mr. Rose
That an order be granted on the Treasurer in
favor of Andrew. Rathwell for the sum of thirteen
 $\frac{33}{100}$ dollars, being $\frac{2}{3}$ value of sheep killed by dogs
the owners of which he could not ascertain,
according to his & Mr. G. Crozier's evidence.
Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bell and seconded by Mr. Rose
That this Council take no action on petition
of asking for reduction of license fees.
Carried.
