

Town Hall, Cobden

31st Oct. 1891.

The Municipal Council of the Township of Ross, met in the Town Hall, Cobden on the above date, for the transaction of the general business of the Township.

The Reeve in the Chair, Councillors all present, Minutes of previous meeting read and approved, and signed.

Mr. Bulmer gives notice that he will at this present meeting of Council introduce a By-law for the purpose of paying out certain sums of money.

Moved by Mr. Bulmer and seconded by Mr. McAlister, "That By Law, No. 44, for the purpose of paying out certain sums of money, be now brought up and read a first time." Carried.

Moved by Mr. Rose & seconded by Mr. Bell that the following accounts be paid: Jas. Burton \$3.75 Bal. due him Re. John McAlley, Lunatic, Jas. Burton \$6<sup>00</sup>/<sub>72</sub> for plank used in Cobden, Robt. Bulmer \$2.50, Cedars for Culvert, George Pettygrove \$4.00 for covering bridge at a Strathers, Charles McIntyre \$5<sup>00</sup>/<sub>72</sub> work done on 5th Con. Line, S. R. Halpenny \$5<sup>00</sup>/<sub>72</sub> for box drain. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bulmer & seconded by Mr. McAlister that By Law No. 44, be now brought up and read a second time, and that blanks be filled in according to resolution of Council. Carried.

On motion of Mr. Bulmer second by Mr. McAlister By Law No. 74, was read a third time short and passed.

Moved by Mr. McAlister and seconded by Mr. Rose "That Thomas Appleby be allowed 5 days on his next year's Statute Labor, for the time that he worked under Mr. Hill, and that he be allowed this year's statute labor, for the work done in his own section."

Moved by Mr. McAlister and seconded by Mr. Rose, "That an order be granted on the Treas in favor of Robt. Reilly Jr. for the sum of \$3.32 being  $\frac{2}{3}$  value of a sheep killed by dogs, the owners of which he could not ascertain according to his and Mr. Appleby's evidence, carried,

Moved by Mr. McAlister & seconded by Mr. Bell, That an order be granted on the Treas in favor of Robt. Reilly Sr. for the sum of \$10.66 being  $\frac{2}{3}$  value of sheep killed by dogs, the owners of which could not be ascertained, according to his and Mr. Robt. Ritchie's evidence. Carried,

Moved by Mr. Rose and seconded by Mr. Bell, "That an order be granted on Treas in favor of Robt. Reilly Sr. for the sum of one dollar for repairing bridge at Robt. Ritchie's. - Carried,

Moved by Mr. Bulmer & seconded by  
Mr. Maliter, "That the account of Mr.  
Rothwell for five sheep killed by dogs  
be left over until next meeting of Council  
and that Mr. Rothwell shall bring evi-  
dence as to the killing and value of sheep.  
Carried

Moved by Mr. Bell & seconded by Mr. Rose  
"That this Council do now adjourn  
to meet again on Saturday ~~the~~ Dec<sup>r</sup>,  
at the hour of 10. O'clock. A.M. carried
