

Foresters Hall June 1<sup>st</sup> 1907

A special meeting of Council was held here this day for the purpose of making arrangements for the erection of two bridges - one on the Govt. Road opposite the late W. McLaughlin's the other at Palmer's Creek near Jamieson's Line Kiln - and for the crushing of the stone near head of Muskrat Lake.

During the forenoon the members of the Council and the Road Commissioner examined the site for the two bridges, and at 1 o'clock P.M. the Council met in their Hall here, the Reeve in the chair.

On motion of Mr. McDellan seconded by Mr. Bates Duncan McIwan was instructed to have plans of each bridge prepared by some competent person - the McLaughlin Bridge to be cedar, the Palmer bridge to be cedar, concrete buttments and arch, or concrete buttments, with steel girders and cement covering - and to forward said plans to the clerk forthwith.

On motion of Mr. Bates seconded by Mr. McIwan the Road Commissioner was instructed to have the bridge and culvert on Road at head across swamp at head of Muskrat Lake properly repaired and to have the Stone Crusher brought from Igauville as soon as possible, and Mr. Cook was appointed to superintend the crushing and laying of the stone.

On motion of Mr. McDellan, seconded by Mr. Bates the Council then adjourned to meet on Saturday the 29<sup>th</sup> June at 10 o'clock A.M. for the transaction of general business.
