Foresters Falls March 6th 1909
The Regular Meeting of Council was held here this day all the members being present, the Reeve in the Chair.

The minutes of last meeting of Council were read and approved. A communication from The Ontario Municipal Association asking the Council to join in a petition to the Legislature for relief from the heavy responsibilities imposed upon municipalities by Section 606 of the Municipal Act for the non-repair of highways. The Council concurred in the prayer of the petition and directed the clerk to forward it to H. Reid Esq. M. L. A. Applications for the Collectorship were received from Robt Howard and John Jeffrey, Sundry bills and accounts were also presented and considered.

On motion of Mr. Vates, seconded by Mr. Rathwell the sum of Ten Dollars was granted John C. Bulmer for taking census of children between 8 and 14 years of age as req^d by a Special Act passed in the session of 1908

The Auditor's Reports of the Treasurers accounts for 1908 were then read and on motion of Mr. Vates seconded by Mr. Jamison they were adopted. The Clerk was instructed to have the Abstract Statement of Receipts and Disbursements and the Statement of Assets and Liabilities published forthwith in the Cobden Sun

The Council then adjourned for one hour. On re-assembling a deputation consisting of Mr. Humphries Reeve and Mr. Lady, Councillor of Horton waited on the Council with a view of reaching an amicable understanding regarding the maintenance of that part of Goot Road between the Town Line and Bolton's old tavern stand. The deputation presented their view of the question in an able and very gentlemanly manner. They did not press for an immediate decision, but urged the Council to calmly consider the matter in all its bearings. This the Council willingly agreed to do.

On motion of Mr. McEwan seconded by Mr. Vates R. E. Anderson was re-appointed Collector at \$45 per year

In Motion of Mr. Vates seconded by Mr. Jamison Josiah W. Thompson was appointed Pastmaster instead of Albert W. Ross and Edward Barber instead of Wesley Smith

On motion of Mr. Vates seconded by Mr. Rathwell the Reeve was appointed to wait on Mr. W^m Black with a view to reaching an agreement with reference to the right of way between concessions 11 and 12 opposite and adjacent to Lots 7 and 8

Moved by Mr. Jamison seconded by Mr. McEwan that in compliance with the request of the Local Board of Health, Hugh Byce be appointed Sanitary Inspector for the Township at a salary of \$10 per annum
