

Foresters Falls March 4 1911 <sup>th</sup>

Council met here this day at 10 o'clock A. M. All the members were present, the Reeve in the chair.

The Minutes of last meeting of Council were read & adopted.

The Auditor's Report was received, read and adopted.

Communications from the National Sanitarium Association and from the Salvation Army praying for grants to help to carry on the benevolent work of their respective institutions were read and considered. A number of bills and accounts were also presented.

On motion of Mr. McEwen seconded by Mr. Barber, the sum of \$5 was granted in aid of the Rescue work of the S. A.

On motion of Mr. Payne seconded by Mr. Barber, Red Logan was transferred from Road Division No 10 to Road Division No 21.

A requisition from the Trustees of S. S. No 6 Ross praying the Council to raise the sum of \$1500 by the issue of Debentures bearing 5 per cent interest and extending over a period of 18 years to complete the erection and equipment of a new School-House in for said Section was received.

A deputation waited on the Council praying for authority to erect a Telephone <sup>Line</sup> on the Kerr Line to Foresters Falls.

The Council then adjourned for one hour.

On again Meeting Mr. McEwen introduced By-Law No 285 of which he had given notice at last meeting of Council to impose a license fee on travelling troupes and on his motion seconded by Mr. Payne said by-law was read a first time. Mr. Payne gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law to authorize the Kerr Line Telephone Co to erect a Telephone Line along the Government Road northwards to Foresters Falls.

Mr. McEwen gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law to authorize and provide for the issue of debentures to the amount of \$1500 said debentures to bear 5 per cent interest and to extend over a period of 18 years to provide for the completion and equipment of a new School House in and for S. S. No 6 Ross as requisitioned for by the Trustees of said Section.

Messrs W. E. Ross and J. McEwen appeared before Council to urge that the Powering Line from the Dunes Line westward

between Lots 10 and 11 should be included in the Good Roads scheme. This could not be done this year. As to the future the Council promised consideration.

The Goulds Road difficulty was again before the Council. This time a numerous signed petition against the re-opening of the road was presented. On motion of Mr. Barber, seconded by Mr. Payne the Reeve was instructed to seek further information on the subject from the Legal Department of the Municipal Ward.

Mr. Payne then introduced by law No. 286 to authorize the Ker Line Telephone Co to erect a Telephone Line along the Government Road northwards to Foresters Falls and on his motion seconded by Mr Barber said by law was read a first time.

Mr. McEwen then introduced by law No 287 to authorize and provide for the issue of debentures to the amount of \$15 00 said debentures to bear five per cent interest and to extend over a period of 18 years to provide for the completion and equipment of a new school-house in and for S. S. No. 6 Ross and on his motion seconded by Mr. Payne said by law <sup>first time.</sup> was read a

On motion of Mr. Payne seconded by Mr Barber the Reeve was appointed as a representative of the Township to accompany a delegation <sup>to Ottawa</sup> who propose to interview Messrs Mackenzie and Mason with reference to the extension of the C. N. R. R. westward from Ottawa.

On motion of Mr. Jamieson, seconded by Mr. Barber by law No. 285 was then read a second & 3<sup>rd</sup> time short and passed. The Clerk was instructed to request Dr. Brown to furnish a detailed account of his work performed as Medical Health Officer for the years 1909 and 1910.

On motion of Mr. McEwen, seconded by Mr. Jamieson by law No. 286 was then read a second and third time short & passed.

On motion of Mr Barber seconded by Mr. Jamieson by law No. 287 was then read a 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> time short and passed.
