 Foresters Falls June 24 1911

Pursuant to adjournment Council met here this day at 10 o'clock P.M. all the members being present, the Reeve in the chair. The minutes of last meeting were read and approved. A number of requests for road grants were read and considered.

On motion of Mr. Payne seconded by Mr. McEwen, the sum of \$10 was granted John Jeffrey to be expended on the Townline between Ross & Brownly, provided ^{Donnelly} grant an equal amount for the same purpose.

On motion of Mr. Payne seconded by Mr. McEwen the sum of \$5 was granted to repair new road near Bolton's provided Horton grant an equal amount.

On motion of Mr. Payne seconded by Mr. Jamieson, Mr. McEwen was commissioned to have bridge leading to Mrs. Gibbons properly repaired.

On motion of Mr. Jamieson seconded by Mr. Payne Mr. McEwen was also instructed to repair culvert on side line at John Progers.

On motion of Mr. Barber seconded by Mr. McEwen Mr. Payne was authorized to expend \$12 in ploughing and stoning on Cor. 6.

On motion of Mr. McEwen seconded by Mr. Jamieson Messrs. Kirk and Barber were authorized to purchase a gravel pit from Jas. A. McLaughlin if it could be secured on satisfactory terms.

The Council then adjourned for one hour. On again meeting Mr. Thos. Rader was heard with regard to cattle ^{in the village of Foresters Falls} swarming at large at all hours of the night as well as ^{no action was taken by our Council having been all possible to provide a remedy} of the day. Mr. C. G. Coulter ^{for the purpose of providing a remedy} also pressed upon the Council the desirability of having a survey of the ^{Road allowance} been considered opposite Lots 11, 12, and 13 made in the near future. Mr. Barber then introduced the by-law of which he had given notice at last meeting of Council, to re-open that part of Goulds Road recently closed and on his motion seconded by Mr. Payne the clerk was instructed to publish the requisite notices of the intention of the Council to pass said by-law at the next regular meeting of Council.

On motion of Mr. Payne seconded by Mr. Barber Mrs. R. A. Williams was granted the use of the chairs in the Town Hall for the 12th July should they not be needed in Hall on that day.

On motion of Mr. Jamieson seconded by Mr. McEwen the clerk was instructed to write the Council of Horton with regard to the Town Line or the road claimed to be in line thereof from the Garden road to the Queen's Line.

On motion of Mr. Jamieson seconded by Mr. Payne ^{McEwen} the following bills and accts were accepted and orders drawn on the Treasurer for their payment.

The Council then adjourned to meet again on the first Saturday in ^{September} next at 10 o'clock A.M.
