Foresters Falls Dec 16th 1912

A regular meeting of Council was held here this day at 10 o'clock A.M. all the members being present the Reeve in the chair

The minutes of the last regular meeting of Council as well as of the special meeting held at Halcy's Station on Nov 1st last were read and adopted. A considerable number of bills and acts, were read and considered.

Mr. McEwen gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law to provide for the appointment of Deputy-Returning Officers and Poll-Clerks for the three Polling Sub-Divisions of the Township to hold the municipal elections for the ensuing year.

The Council then adjourned for one hour. On again meeting the Rev W. M. H. Quartermaine addressed the Council at some length with reference to the commitment of Mrs. George Guest to the Willia Asylum, the disposal of her three children and on behalf of the Children's Aid Society

Mr. McEwen then introduced by-law No. 303 of which he had given notice for the purpose of appointing Deputy-Returning Officers and Poll Clerks to hold the ensuing Municipal election as well as to take a vote on the question of committing the Statute Labor at the rate of One Dollar per day, and on his motion seconded by Mr. Payne said by-law was read a first time.

On motion of Mr. McEwen seconded by Mr. Barber a donation of \$15⁰⁰ was made to the Children's Aid Society.

On motion of Mr. Payne seconded by Mr. Barber the Clerk was instructed to write to the Board of Railway Commissioners with reference to the taking up of farmers' railway crossings by the C.P.R.R. during the winter season in cases where such crossings are needed by the farmers.

On motion of Mr. Murdock seconded by Mr. McEwen the blanks in by-law No. 303 were filled in as follows:-
