

Foresters Falls Oct 3rd 1914

A regular meeting of Council was held here this day at 10 o'clock A.M. The Reeve and Councillors Mc Ewen and Rathwell were present. The minutes of last meeting of Council were read and adopted. A number of bills and acts were read & considered. Mr. Mc Ewen gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a By-Law to authorize and provide for the levying the County rate, the Township Debenture rate, the Township School rate, the Debenture rate for School Sections 3, 6, 9, 10, 12 and 13 and the local school rates on the various School Sections for the sums asked for by the Trustees thereof.

Mr. Rathwell gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a By-Law to provide for the improvement of certain main and leading roads designated therein in the year 1915 under the terms of the Colonization Roads Act.

Mr. Mc Ewen gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a By-Law to authorize the raising by way of debentures the sum of Three Thousand Dollars for the purpose of building a Town Hall in the Village of Foresters Falls.

Mr. Rathwell then introduced by-law No 323 of which he had given notice to provide for the improvement of certain main and leading roads in the year 1915 and on his motion seconded by Mr. Mc Ewen the by-law was read a first time.

Mr. Mc Ewen then introduced by-law No 324 of which he had given notice to authorize and provide for the levying of the necessary rates for the present year and on his motion seconded by Mr. Rathwell the by-law was read a first time.

At the opening of the afternoon's session Mr. Mc Ewen introduced by-law No 325 of which he had given notice to authorize the raising by way of debentures subject to the assent of the electors qualified to vote thereon to be ascertained by taking a vote on the proposed by-law on the date of the next municipal election, the sum of Three Thousand Dollars for the purpose of building a Town Hall in the Village of Foresters and on his motion seconded by Mr. Rathwell the by-law was read a first time.

On motion of Mr Rathwell the sum of Five Dollars was granted towards the relief of Donald McNaughton an aged and infirm man

On motion of Mr McEwen seconded by Mr Rathwell the following bills and accts were accepted and orders were drawn on the Treasurer for the payment thereof:
