

Forester's Falls, Sept 4th/15.

A regular meeting of the Ross Township Council was held on the first Saturday in September 1915 at 10 o'clock A.M.

The Reeve and councillors McEwen, Rathwell and Jamieson were present.

The minutes of the last meeting of Council were read and adopted.

A number of communications, bills and accounts were presented and considered.

Mr. Samuel Murdock interviewed the Council respecting a road in which he and others were interested. He stated he did not know the exact location of said road, and that he wished to be instructed by the council as to the advisability of doing statute labor thereon.

On motion of Mr. Rathwell, seconded by Mr. McEwen, Mr. Donald McNaughton was granted Five Dollars as charity.

Mr. Rathwell gave notice that he would at this meeting of council introduce a by-law to provide for the improvement of certain main and leading roads designated therein in the year 1916, under the terms of the Colonization Roads Act.

On motion of Mr. Rathwell, seconded by Mr. McEwen, the clerk was instructed to get what information he could from the Registry Office, Pembroke, which would enable the council to deal with the road allowance running in an easterly and westerly direction across Lots 10 and 11 Con. 9.

On motion of Mr. McEwen, seconded by Mr. Rathwell, the Council adjourned for one hour.

Work was resumed by Mr. Rathwell presenting his report on highway near Mr. James Cook's. He stated that said highway would be benefited by drainage.

On motion of Mr. McEwen, seconded by Mr. Rathwell, it was resolved that the Council convey by deed to Mr. John R. Byce the road allowance between Lots 10 and 11 in Con Eleven, said deed to be executed at the expense of the council.

Mr. Rathwell then introduced By-law No. 331 of which he had given notice and on his motion, seconded by Mr. McEwen it was read a first time.

On motion of Mr. Jamieson, seconded by Mr. McEwen the blanks in By-law No. 331 were filled in as follows: —

Road No. 1. Queen's Line from Lot 20 eastward to the town line to complete between Ross and Horton. \$250.

Road No. 2. Across Con. 8 through Lots 26 and 27. \$300.

Road No. 3. Road between Con. 6 and 7 opposite Lots 6 to 8 inclusive. \$200.

Road No. 4. Town Line between Ross and Bromley between Lots 6 and 17 inclusive. \$350.

Road No. 5. Road between Cons. 5 and 6 opposite Lots 19 and 20. \$250.

Road No. 6. Road from Queen's Line to Haley's Station. \$150.

Road No. 7. Proof Line between Lots 10 and 11, running through Cons. 3 and 4. \$250.

Road No. 8. Town Line between Ross and Westmeath from a point in Con. 6 to dividing line between Cons. 7 and 8. \$250.

Road No. 9. Between Cons. 4 and 5 opposite Lots 18 and 17. \$150.

Road No. 10. Proof Line between Lots 10 and 11 opposite Cons. 9 and 8 and 8 & 7. \$700.

Road No. 11. In Con. 2 starting at Butter Factory running south. \$350.

And then By-law No. 331 was read a second time.
