

Council Chambers
Firester's Falls, Town Hall, July 28th 1917.

Ross Township Council meeting was held here on Saturday the 28th of July 1917. Reeve Kirk, Councillors Ireton, Jamieson, McEwen, Rathwell were present with the reeve in the chair.

Minutes of last meeting were read and approved also quite a large number of communications, bills and accounts were considered.

Councillor Ireton, who was commissioned at last meeting of council to examine a piece of highway, reported a culvert was very much needed.

Then on motion of Mr McEwen, seconded by Mr Jamieson, the reeve was instructed to order one galvanized tile for Charles Foss' road division.

Mr Jamieson gave notice that he would at this meeting of council introduce a by-law to authorize the North Renfrew Telephone Company, Limited, to erect and maintain poles, wires or cables upon certain highways in the Township of Ross; and thereupon the said by-law was read a first time and a second and third time short and finally passed.

Mr Jamieson then introduced by-law No. 20 of which he had given notice, and on his motion, seconded by Mr Rathwell, it was read a first time.

On motion of Mr McEwen, seconded by Mr Ireton by-law No. 352 was then read a second and third time short and finally passed.

On motion of Mr Ireton, seconded by Mr McEwen, the clerk was instructed to have the statutory notices published and to have posters printed and posted in accordance with the requirements of the law respecting the closing of the road known as Gould's Line, running through lots 8, 9 & 10, concession One Township of Ross.

On motion of Mr Ireton, seconded by Mr Rathwell, the following bills and accounts were accepted and orders drawn on the Treasurer for same:—
