

Foresters Falls, Oct 26<sup>th</sup> 1918

Council met here this day at 10 o'clock A. M., all the members being present; the Reve in the chair. After the minutes of last meeting of Council had been read and approved, communications, bills and acts were read and considered.

Mr. Barr gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law authorizing and providing for the levying of all necessary rates <sup>for</sup> the present year.

Mr. Barr then introduced by-law No. 364 of which he had given notice to authorize and provide for the levying of the necessary rates for the current year and on his motion seconded by Mr. Rathwell the by-law was read a first time.

Mr. Millar gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law to raise the dog tax in this municipality.

On motion of Mr. Millar, seconded by Mr. Jamieson the blanks in By-law No. 364 were filled in as follows:

and the by-law was then read a second and third time short and finally passed.

Mr. Millar then introduced by-law No 365 of which he had given notice for the purpose of raising the dog tax and on his motion seconded by Mr. Baird the by-law was read a first time.

On motion of Mr Rathwell, seconded by Mr Jamieson it was resolved that instead of the Provincial Dog Tax the tax on dogs in the Township of Ross on and after the passing of this by-law should be as follows:-

\$4<sup>10</sup> for a single dog and \$8<sup>10</sup> for each additional dog, and \$8<sup>10</sup> for a bitch if only one, and \$12<sup>10</sup> for each additional bitch.

These provisions having been incorporated in said by-law it was then read a second and third time short and finally passed

On motion of Mr. Jamieson seconded by Mr. Rathwell the following bills and acts were accepted and orders drawn on the Treasurer for the payment thereof:-
