Frederic Falls, April 5th 1918

A meeting of Council was held here this day, all the members being present. The Reeve in the chair.

The minutes of last meeting of Council having been read and approved, the clerk presented sundry communications, bills and accounts which were taken into consideration.

The Auditor's Report was received and accepted and the clerk instructed to have an abstract statement of the receipts and expenditures for the year 1918, as well as a statement of the assets and liabilities on the 31st December last published in the Renfrew Mercury.

Mr. Rathwell gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law for the purpose of commencing the Statute Labor at the rate of \$1.50 per day of all persons whose statute labor has heretofore been performed on any of the roads that have been selected as County Roads under the County Road By-law

The council agreed to furnish fence wire for a fence between the Town Hall lot and J. Moxam's lot on condition that the latter complete the fence.

The clerk was instructed to order 12 in. tile for a 16 ft. culvert on the street leading to W^m Mordy's the same to be put in by the Foresters Falls Street Committee

Mr Rathwell then introduced by-law no 368 of which he had given notice to commute the Statute Labor in certain Road Divisions, and on his motion, seconded by Mr. Jamieson the by-law was read a first time

On motion of Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. Millar the clerk was requested to sign the protest of The United Farmers of Ontario against the Provincial Good Roads Scheme. On motion of Mr. Millar, seconded by Mr Barr by-law no 368 was then read a second and third time short and finally passed

The clerk was instructed to notify Robert Little to remove his stump fence of Road Allowance on proof line between Lots 10 and 11 Con-4 Twp. of Ross
