

Foresters Falls June 28<sup>th</sup> 1919

Council met here this day all the members being present, the Reeve in the chair.

The minutes of last meeting of council were read & approved. A number of bills and accounts including one from the M. O. H. for quarantining, attending and disinfecting 28 small-pox patients at \$10 each were presented and considered.

Mr. Barr gave notice that he would at this meeting of council introduce a by-law to authorize the Reeve and Treasurer to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia the sum of \$3000 to cover the expenses of the Good Roads Scheme.

In motion of Mr. Rathwell seconded by Mr. Barr the Reeve was appointed to meet a representative of Westmeath to decide on the sum required to put Town Line between McNeil's Hill & Munsie Lake in passable condition.

The clerk was also instructed to request John Mc Nab, Reeve of Horton to send a representative to meet Mr. Rathwell at Bolton's corner to determine what repairs are necessary on Town Line between Robt. Mullens and Walter Pices and also to examine new Road constructed jointly in lieu of a section of Good Road which is said to be in a dangerous condition.

Messrs Barr and Rathwell reported on repairs necessary on Road through Lot 10 Con. 9.

Mr. Barr then introduced by-law No 369 of which he had given notice to authorize the Reeve and Treasurer to effect a loan of \$3000 to defray the expenses of Good Roads scheme and on his motion seconded by Mr. Millar the by-law was read a first time.

On motion of Mr. Barr seconded by Mr. Jamieson that H. Pattinson and J. Muddick be allowed \$10 for putting in tile and repairing culvert on Road through Lot 10 Con. 9 the Council to supply the tile and \$35 to gravel said piece of Road.

On motion of Mr. Jamieson seconded by Mr. Rathwell By-Law No 370 was then read a second and third time short and finally passed.

On motion of Mr. Rathwell seconded by Mr. Jamieson the Treasurer was authorized to issue cheques to the Road Commissioners for the sums allotted under Good Roads By-law to the several Roads.

The clerk was instructed to order 12 in Culvert tile from the Pedlar People for 3 Culverts to be shipped Herbert Miller via C.N.R.

On motion of Mr Rathwell seconded by Mr Jamieson James Sheehan was appointed Overseer for Road Number 3 instead of James Dunbar resigned and James Dunbar was appointed Overseer for Roads Nos. 5 and 6 instead of Francis Prozier, resigned.

On motion of Mr. Jamieson seconded by Mr. Barr the following bills and acct were accepted and orders drawn on the Treasurer for the payment thereof:-
