Foresters Falls Dec 15 1919

A meeting of Council was held here this day, the Reeve and Councillors Millar and Rathwell being present.

The minutes of last meeting of Council were approved. A large number of bills and accounts were presented and taken into consideration. Amongst other communications the principal were one from White & Johnson Pembroke containing the award of Judge McLean in the matter of the claim of J. Brown M.D. Medical Health Officer against the Township of Ross as well as their own bill of costs and a letter from W. R. Kirk offering to sell a roadway 40 ft wide from the Government Road to the C. N. R.'s Right of Way to grade the same to a width of 20 ft and to fence said roadway with a wire fence for the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.

Mr Rathwell gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law to make provision for the holding of the municipal election for the ensuing year.

On motion of Mr Rathwell seconded by Mr. Millar the remuneration of Reeve and Councillors while attending Council or acting as Road Commissioners was fixed for the future at \$4<sup>00</sup> per day instead of \$2<sup>50</sup> as at present.

Mr. Rathwell then introduced by-law No 273 of which he had given notice and on his motion seconded by Mr. Millar the by-law was read a first time.

The Council expressed their approval of the proposal to purchase a roadway to the C. N. R.'s Stock-Yards and appointed Reeve McEwen to interview Mr Kirk on the matter.

On motion of Mr Millar seconded by Mr Rathwell the blanks in by-law No 273 were filled in as follows:-

and the by-law was then read a second and third time short and finally passed.

The Council resolved that ~~the~~ vote of the electors on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of January next shall be taken to determine whether the proposed Town Hall the cost of which is to be provided for by the issuing of debentures shall be built at Foresters Falls or at or near the Methodist Church on the Queens Line

The clerk was instructed to prepare a statement protesting against recent amendments to the Public Health ~~act~~ and praying that County Councils may be given control over Public School Inspectors, said statement to be submitted to the next meeting of Council for their approval with a view to forwarding <sup>it</sup> to our local Member of Parliament Mr Warren with an urgent request that he use his influence to secure redress of the intolerable grievances to which the people are subjected in these regards.

On motion of Mr Miller seconded by Mr Rathwell the following bill and accts were accepted and orders drawn on the Treasurer for the payment thereof:
