

Foresters Falls Jan. 10th 1921

The first meeting of Council for the present year was held here this day. The Reeve and all the members of last year's council having been duly re-elected by acclamation made the usual declaration of office and took their seats.

The minutes of last meeting of Council were read and approved, and communications, bills and accounts presented and taken into consideration.

Mr. Barr gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law for the appointment of Township officers for the present year.

Mr. Jamieson gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law to authorize and provide for the payment of salaries, bills and accounts and all other necessary expenditures for the present year.

Mr. Barr then introduced By-Law No 385 of which he had given notice and on his motion, seconded by Mr. Miller the By-Law was read a first time.

Mr. Jamieson then introduced By-Law No. 386 of which he had given notice and on his motion, seconded by Mr. Rathwell the By-Law was read a first time.

The Clerk was instructed to insert the names of all Township officers appointed in By-Law No. 385 and it was then read a second and third time short and finally passed.

The Clerk was instructed to insert all orders drawn on the Treasurer in By-Law No. 386 and it was then read a second and third time short and finally passed.

On motion of Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. Rathwell, the tender of the Cobden Sun for the Township Printing for the present year was accepted.

On motion of Mr. Jamieson, seconded by Mr. Miller, N. J. Oates and Wm. H. Collins were appointed Auditors to audit the Treasurer's accounts for the year 1920.

On motion of Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Jamieson the members of Council were appointed to act as road commissioners in their respective localities.

 F. J. Mooram. Board of Health, D. McEwen and Wm Payne.
 Committee to look after quarantined patients: F. J. Mooram,
 Francis Crozier and John McGinn
 Tyrant Officer, Miss J. Sheehan

The appointment of all other officers was postponed.

 for applications for the Township Clerkship
