The clerk was instructed to write the treasurer to send bond for \$6000, for the bonding of treasurer. It was moved by Councilor Bar seconded by Councilor Rathwell that the auditors report be accepted. Carried.

Council then adjourned for one hour.

On re-assembling, a petition with a large number of names attached, was presented by J. H. Hilliard Guest requesting a grant of One Thousand (\$1000.00) from the Council towards building a hall on Queens Line, The Queens Line Women's Institute to undertake the completion of the hall and the Council to have the right to the free use of the Hall for Township purposes. It was moved by J. H. Bar seconded by Bert Fraser that Bylaw No 390 be amended as follows:-

The amount of money to be expended on Roads No 1, No 2, No 8 and No 5 to be increased to \$200.00, respectively.

It was moved by Councilor Rathwell seconded by Councilor Bar that the question of donating a grant toward the building of a Township Hall be postponed until after the Municipal Elections next January, and that the question of site and building be decided by a vote of the people. Carried.

It was moved by Councilor Bar seconded by Councilor Jamieson that the councilors act as commissioners in their own division. Carried.

On motion of Councilor Jamieson seconded by Councilor Fraser the following bills and accounts were accepted and orders drawn of the treasurer for payment of same, -
