Motion of L. Curry and T. Jeffrey, Reeve Wallace was appointed to see the Reeve of Boston Township re repairing of Government road in Eighth Concession which passes through Township of Boston.

Mr. Jeffrey then introduced By-Law 1475 of which he had given notice and on his motion seconded by John Dretton was read a first time. On motion of J. Dretton seconded by L. Curry the blanks in By-Law 1475 were filled in as follows:-
