Meeting called for the purpose of passing a By-Law, authorizing the Reeve and Treasurer to borrow money to meet the shortage on the County Goods Road Account. due May 1st. John Ineson gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a By-Law, to borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$3000⁰⁰ and on his motion seconded by R. A. Fraser By-Law (No 481) was read a first time.

On Motion Thos Jeffrey seconded by Laughlin Curry By-Law (No 481) was read a second and third short and finally passed.
