Forester's Falls Sept. 2, 1933

Pursuant to adjournment Ross Council met on the above date with all members present. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved and signed by the Reeve. Mr. Scott, stone-cutter of Cobden

came before the Council asking the privilege to remove certain stone from the White Granite Quarry Queen's Line. It was moved by Thos. Jeffrey and seconded by Bert Fraser that this privilege be granted.

Bills and communications were then read and considered.

Mr. Jeffrey gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council introduce a by-law authorizing and providing for the levying of all necessary rates for the present year. The Council then adjourned for one hour for dinner.

On reassembling Mr. McLean's (Superior) offer of 50¢ per ton for refuse stone at the White Granite Quarry was taken up. After considerable discussion it was moved by Jack Iretox and seconded by Laughlin Curry that said offer be accepted. The motion carried.

The clerk was instructed to write the County-clerk re Mrs. Wm R. Holden, Haley's Str. as being an indigent patient and resident of this township.

It was moved by R. A. Fraser and seconded by Thos. Jeffrey that Councillor L. Curry inquire into the condition of Mrs. Wm. Offin. Councillors Iretox and Curry were appointed a committee to examine award ditch between concessions 5 and 6.

Moved by Thos. Jeffrey and seconded by Jack Iretox that By-Law No 1483 of which he had given notice be now introduced for the first time. It was moved by

Laughlin Curry and seconded by W. A. Grasse what the blanks in said By-Law No 483 he filled in as follows:
