Foresters Falls. February 6 - 1937

The Municipal Council of Ross Township met at above date, all members present except Mr. Jeffrey absent through illness.

Minutes of former meeting were read and adopted.

After Bells + Communications were read and considered, Council adjourned one hour for dinner.

On reassembling a number of applications for the office of Clerk and Treasurer were dealt with. In response to an ad in the Cobden Sun fourteen applications were received. A study of said applications indicated all applicants eminently qualified. Four applications for the dual office were set aside, offices having been advertised separately. Out of the four applications for Treasurer, Mr. Hugh Wilson, Post Master at F. F. was selected, Salary \$90.00 plus postage + stationery. ~~Both~~ A vote on applications for the office of Clerk gave Mr. W. H. McMillan the preference at a salary of \$185.00 plus postage + stationery. Both officials were duly notified of their respective appointments. The Bank of Nova Scotia and other institutions requiring the names of new appointees were to be duly notified.

Albert Wallace and John Ireton were appointed to meet Mr. H. B. Johnson at Cobden at their earliest convenience in connection with a proposed Sale of Debentures for S. S. No. 6.

An audit of the Township accounts having been concluded by Messrs. Mayhew and Derby was presented to Council, after having been examined councillor Fraser was requested to have a duplicate of audit made by said auditors to forward to the Dept. of Municipal Affairs in accordance with Sec 245 S. S. 2 Municipal Institutions

A number of pay sheets in connection with work done under Northern Development By-Law that had been returned by Dept. Auditors for corrections were then examined and corrected in accordance with instructions and were left with the Reeve to be returned to Dept. Auditors. Council decided that in future the respective foremen under this By-Law would have to be held to a more strict and careful accounting as considerable difficulty and delay has been met with in securing the 50 per cent Provincial subsidy.
