

Foresters Falls. Saturday Sep. 4 - 1937

The Municipal Council of the Township of Ross met on the above date at 90. A.M. The Reeve and all members of Council present.

Minutes of last meeting were read, approved of, and signed by the Reeve.

Bills and communications were read and considered.

Mr. Fraser gave notice that he would at this meeting of Council, introduce a By. Law for the purpose of setting the necessary rates to be levied for the year 1937.

A Petition was presented to Council signed by a goodly number of the residents of Foresters Falls, asking that the Township supply Hydes lighting on their streets.

The Clerk was instructed to take the necessary steps in connection with same, and correspond with the Hydes Electric Power Commission. Amprior.

Mr. Tom. McMillan and Mr. S. Selmon came before Council asking for the usual grant to the Cobden Agricultural Society.

It was moved by John Dretton seconded by Thor. Jeffery that Council give the above named Society a grant of \$50.00 (carried).

The Clerk was instructed to write Howard Delarge. Haley, that he pay \$3.00 per month rent, for the house now occupied by him (Con 2 O.L. 22), beginning with the first of September.

Mr. Fraser then introduced By Law No. 515 of which he had given notice and on his motion seconded by Mr. Bruce, the By. Law was read a first time.

On motion of Mr. Dretton seconded by Mr. Fraser the blanks in the By. Law were filled in as follows and read a second time.
