

Forsters Falls, Ont. September 12th 1959

A special meeting of the Ross Municipal Council was held on above date to discuss the final approval of debentures for Cobden Public School and also to discuss the transfer of certain funds on supplementary by-law to other roads. Members present were Revere S. Childhouse and Councillors Wm. Stone, Geo. Olmstead and R. Oattes.

It was moved by Wm. Stone, seconded by Geo. Olmstead that Council give final approval to the issuing of debentures for the amount of \$80,000.00 for the purpose of financing the erection of a new four room Public School in the Village of Cobden of which S.S. No. 10 Ross forms a part.

Moved by R. Oattes, seconded by Wm. Stone that we apply to the Dept. of Highways to have certain monies provided by by-law No 752 transferred as follows:-
 \$2,000.00 from Bridges & Culverts on Kerr Line to Road Construction on other roads, \$3,000.00 from Road Construction on Kerr Line to Road Construction on other roads. The money to be used ^{for financing} on the following roads:-

1. The road East of Muskrat Lake in Con. 1 from lot 3 to the Townline between Ross & Westmeath Townships.
2. The road in Con. 3 from Lot 8 (Cobden & Forsters Falls Highway), easterly to Lot 11.

Moved by Geo. Olmstead, seconded by H. Pilgrim that Council purchase a wreath for the Cobden & District Legion to be placed on the cenotaph at Cobden November 11th 1959 at a cost of \$10.00.
